

**GATES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
REGULAR MEETING MINUTES
OCTOBER 7, 2009**

The Gates County Board of Commissioners met in Regular Session on Wednesday, October 7, 2009 at 10:00 a.m. Due to a presentation the meeting location was moved from the Commissioners' Room to the main court room, 202 Court Street, Gatesville, NC. Commissioners Jordan, Jernigan, Askew, Nickens and Twine were present. Also present was County Manager, Toby Chappell and County Attorney, Pitt Godwin.

Chairman Jordan called the meeting to order. A prayer was led by Rev. Eugene Fields. Chairman Jordan led the pledge of allegiance.

Approval of Agenda

Chairman Jordan stated Reba Greene-Holley, Extension Director, would like to be added to the Agenda. Anne Blindt would be taking Brad Gardner's place on the Agenda.

Commissioner Twine made a motion to approve the agenda as presented with modifications. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Approval of Minutes

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to approve the September 2 and September 21, 2009 Minutes as presented. Commissioner Askew seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Department Reports

Sandy Pittman, Finance Officer, presented Budget Amendments 17 – 25.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to accept Budget Amendments 17-25 as presented. Commissioner Askew seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mrs. Pittman introduced Brian Starnes, Martin Starnes and Associates, to present the 2008-09 Audit Report. Mr. Starnes stated the audit has been submitted to the local government commission and presented the following highlights: unqualified opinion, internal control findings, no questioned costs, increase in general fund balance to \$2,922,238, decrease in net assets due to capital project expenditures and a cooperative staff. He recommended a Fund Balance Policy be adopted and the Landfill Fund be reviewed.

John Hora, Eure, questioned what role Martin Starnes and Associates plays on the government side.

Mr. Starnes stated his company provided the audit information to the Local Government Commission.

Colleen Turner, Social Services Director, wanted it corrected in the Audit that the Gates County Department of Social Services was not affiliated with East Carolina Behavioral Health. She was also concerned with the lack of communication with her and the Social Services Board. She provided the Commissioners with a written statement. She felt she and the Social Services Board had been vilified for things that were not true.

Pitt Godwin, commented as a citizen of Gates County, he would like to thank the Commissioners, County Manager and staff for their hard work for the County to be in sound financial state it is in today.

Renee McGinnis, Tax Assessor, presented the August Tax Collector's Report. A foreclosure sale has been scheduled for October 27; Mr. Ellis has 25-30 accounts to process at this time.

Morgan Jethro, Planning Director, presented a Major Subdivision Request for the Sugar Hill Subdivision for T. C. Eure. The Planning Board voted to recommend the Commissioners disapprove the request. The Technical Review Committee approved the preliminary major subdivision plat. The Planning Director recommended conditional approval. Ms. Jethro stated the current Zoning Ordinance could be vague on some matters.

Commissioner Jernigan requested Ms. Jethro make efforts to clarify the language in the Zoning Ordinance and return to the Commissioners with the changes as soon as possible.

After discussion and recommendation by the County's Attorney it was determined Mr. Eure's request met current rules and regulations.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to approve the Major Subdivision Request for the Sugar Hill Subdivision for T. C. Eure with no modifications. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

After a brief recess Chairman Jordan called the meeting back to order.

Reba Greene-Holley, Extension Director, presented a North Carolina 4-H Centennial Proclamation resolving October 4-10, 2009 be designated as the Centennial Anniversary of 4-H in North Carolina and the North Carolina 4-H Program be recognized and commended for its 100 years of service.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to adopt the North Carolina 4-H Centennial Proclamation. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

The Proclamation reads as follows:



NC 4-H Centennial Proclamation

WHEREAS, the 4-H program in North Carolina began with the founding of the Hertford County Boy's Corn Club in 1909, under the direction of I.O. Schaub, learning how to use improved production methods to grow corn on their farm; and,

WHEREAS, the first girls' 4-H program grew out of the Jamestown and Pleasant Garden Girls' Tomato Clubs in Guildford County, where girls grew 1/10 acre of tomatoes and canned them using improved production and home canning methods; and,

WHEREAS, African American boys' and girls' 4-H programs were begun in Sampson County in 1914, under the direction of G.W. Herring, whereby boys and girls learned how to grow vegetable gardens and poultry to supplement their family diets; and,

WHEREAS, the 4-H program that we know today evolved out of these other programs in the 1920s with the motto, "To Make The Best Better" through the wise and effective use of the four "H's," representing Head, Heart, Hands and Health; and,

WHEREAS, through its 100 years of existence, more than 6.5 million youth and 19,000 volunteers touch and enhance the lives of others during National 4-H Week and throughout the year by doing good, by giving where there is a need, rebuilding what has been torn down, teaching where there was a desire to learn, and inspiring those who had lost hope; and,

WHEREAS, through its 100 years of existence in North Carolina, the 4-H program has reached boys and girls with educational and developmental programs that have contributed significantly to the quality of life for these young people and their families; and

WHEREAS, 4-H is viable in Gates County as a result of a partnership between N.C. State University and N.C. A&T University and Gates County Commissioners; and

THEREFORE, I, Henry Jordan, Chairman, Gates County Commissioners, **RESOLVE**, that October 4-10, 2009 be designated as the Centennial Anniversary of 4-H in North Carolina and that the North Carolina 4-H program be recognized and commended for its 100 years of service to the people of this State and the contributions it has made and is making through the dedicated efforts of North Carolina Cooperative Extension employees in the Gates County Center.

Old Business

Chairman Jordan discussed the newly appointed Preservation Commission.

Commissioner Askew stated he would like to keep his motion as presented: not to have a Preservation Commission at this time but introduce it later if needed.

Chairman Jordan stated the Commissioners could not put an ordinance into effect if a commission was not in place.

Commissioner Twine stated this issue should have been researched further.

Commissioner Twine seconded Commissioner Askew's motion to abolish the newly formed Preservation Commission.

Attorney, Pitt Godwin, stated the County was under no legal obligation to have a Preservation Commission.

Earl Rountree, Sunbury, stated he felt the only reason to have a Preservation Commission was to give a few people a tax reduction. He questioned if the Commission was to qualify a house or house and property for a tax reduction. He would like to have the need of the Commission explained further.

Chairman Jordan stated the Preservation Commission develops the rules, regulations and procedures to identify a site for historic recognition.

John Hora, Eure, stated once a site is on the National Historic Register all is needed is a simple rule to show where a property owner makes an attempt to bring the site up to standards.

Commissioner Askew made a motion not to go forward with the Preservation Commission. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion. Commissioners Jernigan, Askew and Twine voted for the motion. Chairman Jordan and Commissioner Nickens voted against the motion. Motion carried with a majority vote.

Earl Rountree, Sunbury, stated Sunbury School is gradually deteriorating and something needs to be done with this site. A site visit needs to be made and a deadline set for taking appropriate action. Rita Lane, Gates County Historical Society member, is meeting with representatives to review options for this site.

Anne Blindt, PCG Landfill Commission, discussed the financial savings achieved when reducing the hours the convenience sites are in operation; a \$5,000 to \$6,200 savings could be achieved by reducing two hours per day.

Mr. Chappell stated the County's budget was based on reducing two hours of operation per day.

Chairman Jordan stated clarification is needed on what items will now be accepted at the convenience sites.

Ms. Blindt stated as of October 1, 2009, #1 - #7 plastics will still be accepted in a separate container; they should not be included with household trash. Wooden pallets and oil filters will have special containers for disposal. The PCG employees will not be going through trash bags to separate these items. The PCG is currently reviewing a new grant for tire recycling.

Mr. Chappell stated Mr. Winn, Emergency Services Director, has hired a part-time fire inspector.

Mr. Chappell presented a contract from Cavanaugh and Associates, P.A., to provide advisory services to the County for the transition period while taking ownership of the Department of Corrections' waste water treatment facility.

Commissioner Twine made a motion to accept the contract from Cavanaugh and Associates, P.A. Commissioner Askew seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mr. Chappell presented Budget Amendment 27 to cover the expense of this advisory service.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to accept Budget Amendment 27 as presented. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Chairman Jordan presented a request by Abrom Saunders to re-appoint John Lane, Fannie Spivey, T. C. Vaughan, Jr. and Whalyn Jordan to the Human Relations Commission.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to approve Mr. Saunders' request to re-appoint John Lane, Fannie Spivey, T. C. Vaughan, Jr. and Whalyn Jordan to the Human Relations Commission for a three-year appointment, October 31, 2009 to October 31, 2012. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Chairman Jordan presented a request to the Board for permission to sign a four-county letter in opposition of OLF.

Commissioner Twine made a motion to authorize the Chairman to sign the requested letter opposing OLF once modifications were agreed upon by all counties involved. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Citizen Comments

Earl Rountree, voiced his concern regarding previous comments made by a Planning Board member and the subject of grandfathering sites. Mr. Rountree has spoke with Mr. Kittrell regarding rebuilding the Sunbury ABC site. Mr. Kittrell stated the County Planner and County Manager had been very congenial and supportive in dealing with this matter. Mr. Rountree also feels the Zoning Ordinance concerns still need to be addressed.

Commissioners' Comments

Chairman Jordan stated an Audit Workshop needs to be scheduled tentatively on October 13, 2009 at 10:00 a.m.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to enter into Closed Session as authorized by NCGS 143-318.11(a)(b) and 143.318.11(a)(2). Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Twine made a motion to exit Closed Session and enter Regular Session. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.




