

**GATES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS  
REGULAR MEETING MINUTES  
JANUARY 6, 2010**

The Gates County Board of Commissioners met in Regular Session on Wednesday, January 6, 2010 at 10:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Room, 202 Court Street, Gatesville, NC. Commissioners Twine, Jernigan, Askew, Nickens and Jordan were present. Also present was County Manager, Toby Chappell, and County Attorney, Pitt Godwin.

Chairman Twine called the meeting to order. A prayer was led by Rev. Eric Earhart. Chairman Twine led the pledge of allegiance.

**Approval of Agenda**

Chairman Twine stated two items needed to be added to the agenda; a citizen's comment period needs to be added directly with Old Business and Reba Greene-Holley, Extension Director, needs to be added to the Department Reports.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to approve the agenda with additions. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

**Approval of Minutes**

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to approve the minutes as presented. Commissioner Jordan seconded the motion. Motion carried without opposition.

**Department Reports**

Sandy Pittman, Finance Officer, presented Budget Amendments 37 – 43.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to accept Budget Amendments 37-43 as presented. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Renee McGinnis, Tax Assessor, presented the November Tax Collector's Report and provided an update through December.

Reba Greene-Holley, Extension Director, presented a Memorandum of Agreement between the North Carolina Cooperative Extension Program/North Carolina A & T State University and Gates County regarding funding for the 4-H Agent's position. The proposed proportional salary funding agreement is 50% from the County and 50% from NC A & T University. Previously the funding agreement was 46% from the County and 54% from A & T University.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to accept the Memorandum of Agreement as presented for the 4-H Agent's position. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion. Commissioners Jordan and Nickens voted for the motion. Chairman Twine and Commissioners Jernigan and Askew voted against the motion. The motion did not carry by a majority vote.

Chairman Twine asked Mr. Chappell to contact A & T University and discuss the possibility of having the same funding agreement as in the past with the County's portion being 46% and not 50% as currently proposed and report his findings at the January night meeting.

**Old Business**

Mr. Chappell gave an update regarding handicapped parking. The County is not required to add any additional handicapped parking spaces.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to increase the number of handicapped parking spaces in front of the courthouse to two (2). Commissioner Askew seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Jernigan questioned if the lines for all parking spaces could be re-painted. Mr. Chappell stated he will handle the request.

Mr. Chappell updated the Board on the Child Support Enforcement concern. Possibly as many as ten (10) counties will be forming a consortium, tentatively deciding to hire a private firm. He is hoping to make a recommendation at the February meeting.

Commissioner Nickens discussed a sticker/decal system to be used at the convenience sites.

Brad Gardner, Convenience Site Supervisor, stated the County currently produces 5,500 tons of trash, 920 lbs. of trash per person. The amount is below the state level of 1,500-1,600 lbs. per person. Mr. Gardner felt the problem at the convenience sites was more of an enforcement issue than an identification issue. If a sticker/decal system is implemented there will need to be coordination between the convenience sites, Tax Office and Sheriff's Office.

Commissioner Askew stated the best identification system he has located during his research was a card system. He would like to have Mr. Gardner, the Sheriff and Mr. Chappell review this type of system.

Commissioner Jernigan stated the County needed to make it easier for citizens to dispose of trash rather than make it more difficult in order to prevent illegal dumping and littering.

Earl Rountree, Sunbury, stated a study has not been performed to determine if an identification system would save the County money. The stickers would be inexpensive but the system would have to be implemented and he does not feel the Sheriff's Office needed to be involved in trash monitoring.

Mrs. McGinnis stated she did not have the staff to implement a new program.

George Walters, Gates, suggested fines be issued to people using the convenience site illegally and to those who dump trash illegally.

Joe Greene, Eure, stated this issue has been discussed long enough and most of the convenience site employees are elderly.

Dan Lang, Gatesville, stated trash dumped by the roadside was more of a trash falling out of the vehicle issue rather than just dumping the trash. People should secure the trash in the back of trucks to prevent it from falling out.

Anne Askew, Eure, stated she would like to see people pick up the trash that falls out of their vehicle; she also pays taxes in other counties and uses their convenience site.

John Hora, Eure, stated there are other ways this can be done. What is the objective of this system? Currently the County is paying \$66/ton or \$.03/lb.

Thomas Langston, Gates, stated he was stopped from disposing of trash in Perquimans County because he was not a resident.

John Hora, Eure, stated he would like for the convenience sites to be open on Tuesdays.

Earl Rountree, Sunbury, stated some of the citizens using the convenience sites driving vehicles with Virginia license or vehicles provided by their employers.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to drop the sticker issue. Commissioner Askew seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Chairman Twine called the meeting to order after a brief recess.

**New Business**

Chairman Twine stated a request has been received from Keith Modlin, Fire Chief, Sunbury Volunteer Fire Department, to appoint Daniel Bright for a two-year term to the Firefighter's Relief Fund Board.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to accept Keith Modlin's letter of request to appoint Daniel Bright for a two-year term to the Firefighter's Relief Fund Board. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Chairman Twine stated a Commissioner is needed to serve on the County's Personnel Board.

Chairman Twine made a motion to appoint Commissioner Jordan to serve on the Personnel Board. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Chairman Twine stated a Commissioner is needed to serve on the Albemarle Commission Board.

Chairman Twine made a motion to appoint Commissioner Jordan to serve on the Albemarle Commission Board. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Chairman Twine stated the scheduled date for the January night meeting is January 18, the Martin Luther King Jr. Holiday.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to move the night meeting from January 18 to January 20. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mr. Chappell presented a request for surplus and disposition of a 1999 Dodge Caravan currently being used by the Buildings and Grounds Department. This van would be replaced by one removed from the GITS Department fleet.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to surplus the 1999 Dodge Caravan used by the Buildings and Grounds Department, place it on Gov Deals for disposition and have it replaced by a van removed from the GITS Department fleet. Commissioner Askew seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Esther Lassiter, Gates Partners for Health, presented the State of the County Health Report.

Mr. Chappell presented a Resolution to the Honorable Bev Perdue and the General Assembly to support the construction of an Aviation Park at College of the Albemarle and Elizabeth City State University.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to approve the Resolution to the Honorable Bev Perdue and the General Assembly as presented. Commissioner Askew seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

The Resolution reads as follows:

**A RESOLUTION TO THE HONORABLE BEVERLY PERDUE, GOVERNOR  
AND  
THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA**

**NOW WHEREAS**, the Elizabeth City-Pasquotank County Aviation Research and Development Commerce Park has been very successful in attracting high-wage employers in the heart of the fourth poorest Congressional district in the United States,

**AND WHEREAS**, DRS Technologies already employs 300 engaged in the maintenance, repair and overhaul of aircraft (MRO) adjacent to the Aviation Park,

**AND WHEREAS**, the average salary at DRS of more than \$48,500 is more than \$21,000 higher than the average private sector salary in Pasquotank County,

**AND WHEREAS**, DRS already has leased four sites in the Aviation Park for future expansion,

**AND WHEREAS**, Pasquotank County has been identified in a Workforce Needs Assessment study prepared for the Golden LEAF Foundation as a county with a high concentration of aerospace industries,

**AND WHEREAS**, the Golden LEAF study projects that aerospace companies doing business in North Carolina will need to fill nearly 6,000 positions by the year 2017,

**AND WHEREAS**, the Golden LEAF study identifies certification of an FAA-approved training provider as a key necessity for aircraft maintenance, repair and overhaul operations,

**AND WHEREAS**, the Aviation Park has the potential to provide tremendous economic opportunity to citizens of the entire seven-county region served by the College of the Albemarle *provided* they have the opportunity to train for these positions,

**AND WHEREAS**, the planners of the Aviation Park had the foresight to include space for a 15-acre campus for a College of the Albemarle FAA-certified Airframe and Power Plant maintenance training facility and the Elizabeth City State University School of Aviation Science,

**AND WHEREAS**, the \$2.5-million College of the Albemarle facility has been designed so that it could be built stand-alone prior to the construction of the \$15-million Elizabeth City State University School of Aviation Science,

**AND WHEREAS**, the absence of an FAA-certified training program at the Aviation Park will force DRS and other future tenants of the Aviation Park to import employees from other states and other regions that have such programs,

**AND WHEREAS**, the College of the Albemarle has been awarded \$580,000 by Golden LEAF to hire an individual qualified to develop an FAA-certified Airframe and Power Plant maintenance program,

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Gates County Board of Commissioners petition the Honorable Beverly Perdue, Governor, and the members of North Carolina General Assembly to fund construction of the College of the Albemarle facility in the 2010-2011 fiscal year so that the citizens of the seven-county region served by the College of the Albemarle may have the same opportunity to compete for jobs in the aerospace industry in their own backyard as citizens from other states and other regions where FAA-certified programs already exist. Passed this 6th day of January in the year 2010

Commissioner Askew responded to a previously discussed gamelands concern, the County has no jurisdiction regarding the use of center fire rifles.

Chairman Twine stated Chris Lowie, Manager of the Great Dismal Swamp Wildlife Refuge, was ineligible to serve on the Coastal Resources Commission because he resided in Virginia. George Owens, NC Wildlife Officer, has submitted his application for this position.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to enter into Closed Session as authorized by NCGS 143-318.11(1)(4)(6). Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to exit Closed Session and enter Regular Session. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to recess until 7:00 p.m. on January 20, 2010. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.
