

Gates County Board of Commissioners
Regular Meeting Minutes
July 7, 2008

The Gates County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Monday, July 7, 2008, at 10:00 a.m. in the County Commissioners' Room, 202 Court Street, Gatesville, NC. Commissioners Pierce, Askew, Jernigan, and Nickens were present. Also present was Interim County Manager, Justin Hembree.

Chairman Pierce called the meeting to order. A prayer was conducted by Rev. Billy Presley. The pledge of allegiance was led by Chairman Pierce.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to approve the minutes with the following changes: June 2, 2008 Meeting Minutes, Commissioner Nickens attended the meeting at the Ahoskie Town Hall with Commissioners Askew and Jernigan and a letter of thanks needs to be sent to Bill Muse with Gates County Schools. Commissioner Askew seconded the motion, motion carried with no opposition. A copy of the corrections to be cross-referenced is as follows:

In Minute Book 12, on page 329, in the June 2, 2008 Regular Meeting Minutes, Commissioner Jernigan stated he and Commissioners Askew and Nickens were at a meeting at the Town Hall in Ahoskie recently with the Department of Transportation.

In Minute Book 12, on page 328, in the June 2, 2008 Regular Meeting Minutes, Commissioner Nickens would like the Board to thank Crystal Boone, Supervisor of Building and Grounds, and send a letter to Willie Earl Hofler and Bill Muse, Gates County Schools, for their help in getting our air conditioner running.

Paulette Wester, representing the Democratic Party, stated Gates County has followed all recommendations by the State Board of Elections pertaining to the runoff election. Mr. Graham Twine won the election.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to accept Graham Twine as the fifth member of the Board of Commissioners. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried with no opposition.

Nell Wiggins, Clerk of Superior Court, came forward to swear in Mr. Twine.

Chairman Pierce welcomed Commissioner Twine to the Board.

Scheduled Appointments

Colleen Turner, Director of the Department of Social Services, discussed the preparation of the 2009-2011 Work First Family Assistance (WFFA) Plan. The Board needs to declare its intent to either become an "Electing County" or remain a "Standard County." Electing County status would require that the Board, in conjunction with key DSS staff and Board members, establish the county's outcome and performance goals and participation rates and develop the Employment Programs to meet those goals and rates. Standard County status means that the county WFFA Program would adhere to the outcomes, performance goals and participation rates established at the state and federal level. Gates County has traditionally maintained Standard County status. On June 23, 2008, the Board of Social Services voted unanimously to remain in Standard County status.

Commissioner Askew made a motion for the county to continue as "Standard County status." Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion passed with no opposition.

Mrs. Turner also stated the Planning Committee needs to be appointed by the Commissioners. She provided the Board with a list of participants for their consideration and approval. Commissioner Jernigan has agreed to represent the Boards of Commissioners, Public Health and Mental Health.

Commissioner Twine made a motion to accept the Planning Committee as presented. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion passed with no opposition.

Mrs. Turner also wanted to give an update on the Housing Project. At a meeting on June 28th in the courthouse, approximately 20 churches were represented to discuss partnerships with local government and other agencies to improve unsafe housing issues that have been encountered. Currently five (5) individuals/families have been referred and matched to a supporting church. This is not a grant, it is a volunteer partnership. It is a matter of identifying the individual and matching them with a church that can support them and identifying the resources.

Randall Cahoon, Director of Planning and Development, presented a Planning Board request for a Public Hearing to discuss a change to the Zoning Ordinance that would require persons interested in keeping horses on their property have a dedicated two (2) acres per horse of cleared pasture-land exclusive of the one (1) acre set aside for their home and accessory buildings. Mr. Cahoon personally did not agree with the Planning Board and felt this action was a rush in judgment based on pressure from a citizens group. Mr. Cahoon suggested options to the Commissioners: reject the Planning Board's recommendation without comment, set the requested public hearing and request a review of the proposed language or devote the second half of the July 21st night meeting to a town-hall style meeting to allow the public to come and express their feelings and concerns. Mr. Cahoon stated there would be no grandfathering regarding this issue.

Commissioner Twine questioned the status of the Animal Control Ordinance.

Mr. Cahoon stated the Animal Control Ordinance would be next as a write-in on the agenda and Animal Control was not a Planning issue.

Commissioner Nickens stated he would like to see this issue discussed further and have public input before the Board can make a decision.

Commissioner Jernigan stated he has had several calls from citizens regarding this issue and feels we need a meeting to get the public's input.

Commissioner Twine stated citizens' input was definitely needed.

Commissioner Askew stated a public meeting was needed.

Commissioner Twine made a motion to have a public meeting at 7:00 p.m. on July 21st to discuss the two (2) acre per horse zoning issue. The public meeting needs to be held at the last part of the night meeting in the main court room. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Lacy Wilkins, Animal Control Officer, presented the new Animal Control Ordinance. The current two-page ordinance covers public nuisance, barking and viciousness. We have no ordinance covering the health and welfare of an animal.

Henry Jordan asked if the new proposed ordinance covered horses.

Mrs. Wilkins responded it covered every living creature.

Mr. Jordan commented what is creating the interest from the citizens is the abuse of horses in confined areas. This is the reason why citizens have come to the Planning Board to put land restrictions on horses.

Chairman Pierce responded there are so many things that determine how well a horse/animal is treated other than have two (2) acres to walk on. You can put a horse on two (2) acres and starve it or have it on one-half acre and take care of it with veterinarians and medicine. We all hope this will be included in the new ordinance.

Roy Weaver, Willeyton Road, discussed his concern regarding the attitude and actions of Commissioner Jernigan. Commissioner Jernigan had assisted a neighbor in the construction of a deck.

Chairman Pierce called Edgar Mitchell, Director of Building and Inspections, to the podium. Commissioner Nickens asked Mr. Mitchell if Commissioner Jernigan was building the deck at his residence.

Mr. Mitchell stated he was assisting a neighbor but it was originally reported to him that Commissioner Jernigan was building a deck at his own residence.

Commissioner Nickens asked Mr. Mitchell if it was Commissioner Jernigan's responsibility to obtain the necessary permits.

Mr. Mitchell replied it was not Commissioner Jernigan's responsibility to obtain the permits.

John Arlow stated a public meeting was needed on July 21. The citizens understand the county is growing and there are some horses in the county that are in need of care.

Justin Hembree, Interim County Manager, updated the Board on a Resolution for the Proposed Storm Water Regulations. Some of the proposed regulations, if implemented, would have a significant impact on the land available for development in all of the coastal counties. The Senate Committee is meeting July 8 to adopt the proposed regulations. Mr. Hembree recommends the Board sign the Resolution.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to adopt the Storm Water Resolution. Wade Askew seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.

Business

Mr. Hembree gave an update on the draft of the proposed Employee Travel Policy. No action is needed at this time; it will be a future agenda item. All department heads have received a draft copy and we waiting for their comments and recommendations. One item that has been discussed with the county's auditor is the per diem per day for meal expenses. Employees will still need to turn in their actual meal receipts but will only be reimbursed on the allocated per diem. This will keep the county from having to issue a W-2.

Mr. Hembree discussed the Proposed Ordinance Prohibiting Tobacco Use in Buildings Owned By or Leased to Gates County and Public Transportation Vehicles Owned By or Leased to Gates County. During last year's session of the General Assembly a law was enacted that allowed county governments in North Carolina to prohibit tobacco use in county owned buildings, public transit vehicles, department of social services and health departments. Up until that time buildings had to provide a designated smoking area. The term "grounds" is defined as a 50 foot area around the building. This will be the first reading of this policy. The second reading will be on July 21.

Commissioner Twine requested clarification on the Proposed Tobacco Use Policy. Smoking will still be allowed in the parking lot of the court house, just not at the door ways/air intakes, except the department of social services and the health department.

Mr. Hembree stated that Commissioner Twine's interpretation was correct.

Mr. Hembree discussed the Commissioners' Annual Conference to be held August 21st in New Bern. The County Manager's Office will be able to take care of the registration for any Commissioner that plans to attend the conference.

Sandy Pittman, Finance Officer, presented Budget Amendments 86, 87, 88, 89 and 90; item 91 has been deleted.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to accept the Budget Amendments as presented. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.

Commissioner Askew presented and read a copy of the Resolution Against OLF from the Town of Ahoskie.

Commissioner Jernigan stated he has been contacted by a citizen regarding the over-grown shrubs and grounds at Sunbury School. He questioned if the county had a contracted lawn service that would take care of this.

Chairman Pierce stated the last time the grounds were taken care of at Sunbury School it was performed by volunteers. There is a committee looking into what needs to be done with the school, either renovation or to be destroyed.

Commissioner Jernigan stated a member of the Sunbury School Committee was the one who contacted him. The committee will be meeting with a firm to discuss the options for Sunbury School.

Commissioner Nickens stated he attended The Albemarle Regional Solid Waste Committee Meeting. There is to be some clarification on terminology in their new contract. He has not heard from the Committee since the meeting.

Mr. Hembree suggested the Board go into executive session to discuss personnel issues and another issue of possible litigation.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to enter into closed session as permitted by NC General Statutes to discuss personnel matters. Commissioner Askew seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to exit closed session. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to recess the meeting until 1:00 PM on July 21. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.
