

Gates County Board of Commissioners
Regular Meeting Minutes
August 4, 2008

The Gates County Board of Commissioners met in Regular Session on Monday, August 4, 2008, at 10:00 a.m. in the County Commissioners' Room, 202 Court Street, Gatesville, NC. Commissioners Pierce, Jernigan, Askew, Nickens and Twine were present. Also present was Interim County Manager, Justin Hembree.

Chairman Pierce called the meeting to order. A prayer was conducted by Rev. Henry Jordan. The pledge of allegiance was led by Chairman Pierce.

Commissioner Twine made a motion to approve the minutes as written with the following correction: July 7, 2008 Meeting Minutes, Chairman Pierce called Edgar Mitchell, Chief Building Inspector, to the podium. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition. A copy of the correction to be cross-referenced as follows:

In Minute Book 12, page 349, in the July 7, 2008 Regular Meeting Minutes, name correction from Commissioner Nickens to Chairman Pierce asked Mr. Mitchell if Commissioner Jernigan was building the deck as his residence.

Scheduled Appointments

Edgar Mitchell, Chief Building Inspector, presented a request to have a 1500 Series Chevrolet truck to be declared surplus. The truck has been replaced with a new truck.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to surplus the truck so it can be sold. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Justin Hembree, Interim County Manager, stated the re-zoning issue requested by a citizen has been removed from today's agenda but the Board is still requested to review the issue. The area of concern is directed along the highway 13 corridor. The property in this area is zoned primarily agricultural and conservation. The Board needs to review the land use plan for this corridor for it possibly to be re-zoned as residential and commercial. If this property is re-zoned it would be spot-zoning. At this time Mr. Hembree suggests the Board refer this concern to the Planning Board to review and assess the concern.

Mr. Cahoon's concern regarding re-zoning is that it be done correctly. Property is not re-zoned for specific individuals but for a whole area and/or district. Please keep in mind if the 4.5 acres is re-zoned commercial, no home could be placed on it. Mr. Cahoon has a strong concern for a commercial/industrial area to be on the southern corridor of highway 13.

Chairman Pierce questioned if the International truck business was located near this site.

Mr. Cahoon stated it was a good distance way.

Commissioner Twine questioned if there was not a lot of houses in the location in question.

Mr. Cahoon responded yes.

Mr. Hembree stated this is a good time for the Board to review this area with highway 13 being widened.

Commissioner Twine questioned Mr. Cahoon on the completion date for the study being conducted for the waste water treatment plant.

Mr. Cahoon replied it will be approximately 12 more months before Mr. Diehl will have completed the study.

Mr. Hembree responded once the re-zoning issue is complete it will have an impact on the waste water treatment concern.

Commissioner Askew questioned how much time was needed for this review.

Mr. Cahoon responded three (3) to four (4) months.

Commissioner Jernigan questioned if this was an in-house study.

Mr. Cahoon responded it was an in-house study.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to send the re-zoning concern along the highway 13 corridor back to the Zoning Board to review and possibly make an amendment to the land use permit. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mr. Cahoon discussed with the Board a possible Boy Scout Project to be developed in the Sandbanks area. This site is one of eleven (11) sites being considered. It is the same area focused upon by the Navy for the proposed OLF site. The project had certain criteria to be met: 5,000 unbroken acres available for sale, within 25 miles of an interstate or 20 miles of a divided four-lane highway, an abundance of water, within 150 miles of an airport, accessible year round, access to DSL and natural gas. Between \$100,000.00 and \$250,000.00 will go into developing this project. It will be an international Jamboree site with between 86 and 185 permanent employees. It is projected 200,000 people will visit the visitor center each year. The current plans are to also construct a museum, a high adventure area, three (3) hotels, an urgent care center, create their own police station, and pay to install a commercial/industrial style sewer system. This project will be completed by 2013.

Commissioner Jernigan stated he had letters of support of the Boy Scout Jamboree Project to be signed by each Commissioner to be sent to our Congressmen.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion for each Commissioner to sign the letters of support for the Boy Scout Jamboree Project. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Unscheduled Appointments

Joe Greene commended the Board of Commissioners on what a good job they are doing and made reference to a current newspaper article supporting the actions of the Commissioners.

Mr. Roy Weaver, Willeyton Road, stated his concern regarding compensatory time for county employees, particularly the Sheriff's Department. He was requesting the budget for this department to be increased so the deputies could be paid for their compensatory time rather than taking the time off.

Business

Sandy Pittman, Finance Officer, presented Budget Amendment 1.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to accept Budget Amendment 1 as presented by the Finance Officer. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mr. Hembree gave an update on the Proposed Travel Policy originally presented in July. A meeting with the head of all departments will be held on August 5 and this is one of the topics to be discussed. The Travel Policy will also be on the agenda for the September 8th Commissioners' Meeting.

Mr. Hembree presented a list of members to serve on the local Juvenile Crime Prevention Council (JCPC) to be approved by the Board of Commissioners. This program is administered through the Board of Education.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to approve the JCPC Council as recommended. Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mr. Hembree gave an update on the Proposed Animal Control Ordinance. He suggested this be on the agenda for the September 8th Board Meeting and a Public Hearing be held at the night meeting on September 15th.

Commissioner Twine voiced his concern regarding the section on nuisance animals in regard to hunting dogs and farm animals.

Mr. Hembree stated the wording can be adjusted.

Commissioner Askew stated he had the same concern regarding farm animals in regards to noise, smell, etc. He also does not have a problem with cats wearing collars and tags.

Mr. Hembree presented for the Tax Office the schedule of values for the Board's information.

Mr. Hembree also brought to the Board's attention the need to re-schedule the September 1st meeting due to the Labor Day Holiday.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to re-schedule the September 1st Board of Commissioners' Meeting to September 8th. Commissioner Askew seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Jernigan read a letter of thanks from Cynthia Shurling for the time and effort put forth by our staff in assisting with the data collection effort in regards to the ecological and environmental survey conducted for OLF purposes.

Commissioner Nickens stated he has been approached by citizens requesting to alternate Commissioners' Meetings from day to night so more people can attend.

Chairman Pierce stated we are doing that currently with our every other month night meetings.

Commissioner Twine questioned if a public hearing on a popular topic could be held at a special called night meeting.

Mr. Hembree stated yes that could be done.

Chairman Pierce stated he thought the current schedule of meetings was working well. He suggested if the schedule of meetings needs to be revised it could be done at the new year which would begin in December.

Commissioner Nickens stated he was at a Planning Board Meeting and it was brought up that some of the developers in our county were delinquent in paying taxes/fees.

Renee McGinnis, Tax Assessor, stated legislation was passed last year that Gates County could request all taxes be paid before issuing a building permit.

Commissioner Askew questioned if the county had developers with delinquent taxes.

Mrs. McGinnis stated one or two developers were delinquent with their taxes. She could have an ordinance ready for the Board's review by the September 8th Commissioners' Meeting.

Commissioner Nickens stated he thought a sticker/decal system needed to be implemented for the use of the convenience sites.

Mrs. McGinnis stated the Tax Department would need an additional staff member to implement this system.

Chairman Pierce stated this topic had been previously discussed.

Linwood Sills stated he had a neighbor with a business and all the vehicles have Virginia license plates but he still uses the local convenience sites.

Commissioner Askew stated this topic was discussed when Melinda Hoggard was County Manager. It was decided it would cost the county more than the county would recoup.

Henry Jordan stated Pasquotank County has put up signs at the convenience sites stating the site was for residents only.

Jack Owens questioned if a license check from the sheriff's office could take care of this. When an officer checked a driver they could also check for a Gates County address, license sticker and a convenience site sticker/decal at the same time.

Dan Bazemore stated the Land Transfer Tax was defeated for the second time. The Commissioners had the option to vote in a sales tax. Is this currently being discussed?

Chairman Pierce responded with the Land Transfer Tax being defeated twice, if the Commissioners' voted for a sales tax, there would be a great deal of negative comment.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to recess for lunch and to reconvene at 1:00 p.m. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.

The Board reconvened at 1:00 p.m. Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to enter into Closed Session to discuss personnel matters according to G.S. 143-317.11 (a) (b).

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to exit the Closed Session and re-enter Regular Session. Commissioner Twine seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

There being no further business Chairman Pierce adjourned the meeting.


