

**GATES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
REGULAR MEETING MINUTES
MARCH 6, 2013**

The Gates County Board of Commissioners met in Regular Session at 10:00 a.m. Wednesday, March 6, 2013 in the main courtroom, 202 Court Street, Gatesville. Commissioners Jordan, Owens, Hora, Jernigan and Hofler were present. Also present was County Manager, Jon Mendenhall.

Vice-Chairman Owens led a prayer and Chairman Jordan led the pledge of allegiance.

Chairman Jordan called the meeting to order.

Approval of Minutes

Commissioner Hofler made a motion to approve the February 6 Minutes as presented. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Approval of Agenda

Chairman Jordan stated the Agenda needed to be amended by the following: V.4.b. will also include the Tax Report and VIII.11 will include Clearscapes Architects' contract authorization.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to approve the agenda as amended. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Delegations – Unannounced

Cynthia Boone, Gates, stated concerns she had with her child's activities at the Gates County Community Center. She feels the Community Center should do more for the student athletes.

Earl Rountree, Sunbury, stated he wanted to clarify an issue with the Hwy 13/137 intersection that has generated concern. Previously a delegation from Gates County went to the State DOT requesting an intersection change. A stop light at the intersection will prevent the purpose of the 4-lane continuous flow for trucks.

J. E. Harrell, Gates, stated at a previous Commissioners' Meeting he made comments specifically regarding 2012 data gathered and studied pertaining to paying down County debt.

Delegations – Announced

Dr. Kandi Deitemeyer, President, College of the Albemarle, presented an update on the college and programs provided. Tammy Lassiter, a previous student and graduate of COA told how her personal life and professional career had been greatly enhanced and attributed it to her COA education experience.

Administrative Reports

Jon Mendenhall, County Manager, presented the February County Manager's Report.

Gwen Harrell, Deputy Tax Collector, presented the February Tax Collector's Report and Requests for Refunds from Hezekia Watford, \$112.07 and Aaron J. Riddick, \$384.98.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to refund the requests as presented. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Public Hearings

Chairman Jordan presented a request from Briarwood Forest Products to rezone property at Merchants Commerce, 60+ acres, from R-1 to C-1.

Commissioner Hora made a motion to open the Public Hearing for Briarwood Forest Products' rezoning request. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

There being no public comment Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to exit the Public Hearing for Briarwood Forest Products. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to approve the Briarwood Forest Products' rezoning request for 60+ acres from R-1 to C-1. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion. Chairman Jordan and Commissioners Owens and Jernigan voted for the motion. Commissioners Hora and Hofler voted against the motion. Motion carried by a majority vote.

Chairman Jordan presented a request from Mr. Thomas Umphlett to rezone Lots 221, 224, 225, 232, 239 and 240 on Little Island Road and lot 31 on Hunter Lane from R-1 to RMH-1.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to open the Public Hearing for Mr. Thomas Umphlett to rezone seven (7) lots from R-1 to RMH-1. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Chuck Brothers, Planning Board Member, stated the Planning Board voted unanimously to support the rezoning request.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to exit the Public Hearing. Commissioner Hofler seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Hofler made a motion to approve the rezoning request for Mr. Thomas Umphlett to rezone Lots 221, 224, 225, 232, 239 and 240 on Little Island Road and lot 31 on Hunter Lane from R-1 to RMH-1 as requested. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Chairman Jordan called the meeting to order after a brief recess.

Old Business

Patrice Lassiter, GITS Director, presented a contract service agreement with Hertford County DSS to provide transportation services to Hertford County DSS commensurate with and in augmentation to services already provided to Hertford County as a transit system destination.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to accept the contract with Hertford County DSS for access to and use of the Gates Inter-regional Transit System. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mrs. Lassiter presented a statement from the County's attorney regarding the proposed GITS Vehicle Video/Audio Surveillance Systems.

Commissioner Hofler made a motion to accept the legal council's statement for GITS Vehicle Video/Audio Surveillance Systems. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mrs. Lassiter presented a Hazardous Weather Policy for GITS service operators.

Commissioner Hora made a motion to accept the Hazardous Weather Policy for GITS. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Geoffrey Marett, DSS Director, presented a Memorandum of Agreement with the Gates County Housing Committee and the County to administer the Urgent Repair Program. The previous Memorandum of Agreement for CDBG-Capacity Building ended February 2013.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to approve the Memorandum of Agreement between the Gates County Housing Committee and the County as presented. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mr. Mendenhall presented a Memorandum of Understanding between the County and the Town of Gatesville to explore the possible opportunity of consolidation of the County and Town water systems.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to accept the Memorandum of Understanding with the Town of Gatesville. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Sandy Pittman, Finance Officer, presented Budget Amendment 38, \$21,015, to provide funding for Phase II, Clearscapes contract for the Old Courthouse Stabilization and Renovation Project.

Thomas Hill, Secretary, Courthouse Renovation Committee, stated the committee recommended to proceed with Phase II.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to accept Budget Amendment 38 as presented. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Hofler made a motion to approve the Phase II contract with Clearscapes. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mrs. Pittman presented Budget Amendment 36, \$2,930, for Sunbury School Economic Development Incentives.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to approve Budget Amendment 36 per the original agreement. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mrs. Pittman presented Budget Amendment 37, \$25,000, pass through funding for the Sunbury Volunteer Fire Department for access roadway funding from NCDOT.

Commissioner Hofler made a motion to approve Budget Amendment 37 as presented. Commissioner Owens seconded motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mrs. Pittman presented Budget Amendment 34, \$1,193, replacement of equipment at Cooperative Extension.

Commissioner Hora made a motion to accept Budget Amendment 34 as presented. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mrs. Pittman presented Budget Amendment 35, \$1,320, reallocation of Genesis funds.

Commissioner Hora made a motion to accept Budget Amendment 35 as presented. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mr. Mendenhall provided an update on the Animal Control Ordinance review, particularly tethering, enforcement and strays. His recommendation is to create an ad hoc committee.

Commissioner Hora made a motion to direct the County Manager and Clerk to advertise in the local paper for citizens to assemble an Animal Control Committee to review the Animal Control Ordinance. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to request nine (9) members serve on the Animal Control Committee. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Chairman Jordan discussed dates recommended by the Tax Administrator to be considered for the Board of Equalization and Review to open and close. The opening date will be April 29.

Mrs. Pittman presented a Project Ordinance to establish revenue associated with donations received for renovations to the old Gates County Courthouse.

Commissioner Hora made a motion to approve the adoption of the Project Ordinance for the Old Courthouse Restoration Project. Commissioner Hofler seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

The Project Ordinance for the Old Courthouse Restoration Project reads as follows:

**COUNTY OF GATES
PROJECT ORDINANCE
OLD COURTHOUSE RESTORATION PROJECT**

BE IT ORDAINED by the Gates County Board of Commissioners that pursuant to Section 13.2 of Chapter 159 of the North Carolina General Statutes, the following Project Ordinance is hereby adopted:

Section 1. The project authorized is the Restoration of the Old Courthouse located at 115 Court Street, Gatesville, NC.

Section 2. The officers of this unit are hereby directed to proceed with the project within the terms of the agreements and documents related to same.

Section 3. The following revenue source is anticipated to be available to complete this project:

Section 4. The following amounts are appropriated for this project:

Section 5. The Finance Officer is hereby directed to maintain within the Project Fund sufficient detailed accounting records to satisfy the requirements of all funding sources.

Section 6. The Finance Officer is directed to report the financial status of each project element on a monthly basis via regular written monthly reports.

Section 7. The Budget Officer is directed to include a detailed analysis of past and future costs and revenues on this capital project in every annual budget submission made to the Commissioners during the duration of the project.

Section 8. Copies of this Project Ordinance shall be furnished to the Clerk to the Board, Budget Officer, and Finance Officer for direction in carrying out this project.

Section 9. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 10. This ordinance shall become effective upon its adoption.

Further be it resolved that Edgar Mitchell and Renee McGinnis shall be appointed to serve as Deputy Review Officers in the absence of the Review Officer in the order of precedence presented. All other appointments as Review Officer are null and void as of the effective date.

Mr. Mendenhall presented a Resolution Supporting Continued Funding for the Museum of the Albemarle.

Commissioner Hofler made a motion to adopt the Resolution Supporting Continued Funding for the Museum of the Albemarle. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

The Resolution Supporting Continued Funding for the Museum of the Albemarle reads as follows:

GATES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
A RESOLUTION
SUPPORTING CONTINUED FUNDING FOR MUSUEM OF THE ALBEMARLE

WHEREAS, Museum of the Albemarle serves a 13 county area that spans Northeastern North Carolina and is one of six divisional museums of the North Carolina Museum of History; and

WHEREAS, Museum of the Albemarle opened its first museum on May 29, 1967 in the old Highway Patrol building south of Elizabeth City; and

WHEREAS, property was donated for a site and following a fundraising campaign and delays due to state budget shortfalls, a new 50,000 square foot museum was constructed using local and state resources; and

WHEREAS, the new Museum of the Albemarle opened on April 8, 2006 and is a wonderful facility that includes large public gathering areas, meeting and conference rooms, a 200 seat auditorium, 11,000 square feet of lobby and galleries, and 3,5000 square feet of collection storage; and

WHEREAS, the museum is a regional resource center that houses historically significant regional artifacts and state-of-the art displays that provide rare opportunities for inquiry and learning; and

WHEREAS, some of the current exhibits which are quite significant for our area include "Our Story: Life in the Albemarle", "Out of the Blue: Coast Guard Aviation", "Under Both Flags: Civil War in the Albemarle"; and

WHEREAS, over the past 45 years, Museum of the Albemarle has shown hundreds of exhibits, collected, displayed and cared for thousands of regional artifacts, conducted hundreds of educational programs, given general tours to thousands of regional school children, and educated, entertained and showed off the amazing history of the Albemarle area; and

WHEREAS, Museum of the Albemarle has become a vital resource for our area;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Gates County Board of Commissioners supports funding for continued operation of Museum of the Albemarle and requests the Governor and General Assembly to include full funding in the state's 2013-2014 budget for Museum of the Albemarle.

Mr. Mendenhall stated there are roadway concerns in the Eure District pertaining to the intersection of widened US 13 and existing NC 137.

Johnny Blake Parker, Eure, stated the traffic has increased on NC 137 and presented a petition signed by citizens requesting a stoplight at the Hwy 13 and NC 137 intersection. He asked the Board to sign letters of concern to be sent to Rep. Annie Mobley and Senator Bill Cook.

Earl Rountree, Sunbury, stated the Board needs to appear in person to ask for support rather than send a letter.

Sam Armstead, Gatesville, stated a dangerous situation will arise with the current planned intersection.

Graham Twine, Hobbsville, stated while serving as a Commissioner he and four (4) of the present Board members were presented statistics by DOT validating the Superstreet Concept as being much safer than an intersection with a stoplight. At that time the Board opted not to pursue the idea of a stoplight.

Commissioner Hora made a motion the County Manager contact the Governor's office to schedule a time when the Board can meet with him to discuss the Hwy 13 concern and send an electronic letter with the signed petitions attached.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion that Rep. Mobley and Senator Cook receive copies of the letter and petition. Commissioner Hofler seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Citizens' Comments

Graham Twine, Hobbsville, discussed the Town of Gatesville's water system. He asked the Board to please take into consideration there is a great deal of asbestos pipe in the Town's system. He is currently working with Al Carey on the development of Merchant's Commerce and discussed some of those activities. He is working out of the goodness of his heart and not being paid.

Reba Green-Holley, Cooperative Extension Director, presented 4-H recognition favors to the Board and thanked them for their support.

Thomas Hill, Sunbury, recommended Mr. Bailey from Corapeake be contacted to serve on the Animal Control Committee; he also request the Sheriff's Department enforce the Animal Control Ordinance.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to enter Closed Session authorized by NCGS §143-318.11(a)(4) economic development, (5) property acquisition and (6) personnel. Commissioner Owens seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to exit Closed Session and enter Regular Session. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Hofler made a motion to proceed with the action plan as discussed in Closed Session. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion. Chairman Jordan and Commissioners Hora, Jernigan and Hofler voted for the motion; Commissioner Owens voted against the motion. Motion carried by a majority vote.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to instruct the County Manager to proceed with the organizational plans as discussed. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to instruct the County Manager to secure pictures in the old courthouse. Commissioner Hofler seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Hora made a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.
