

**GATES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
REGULAR MEETING MINUTES
September 4, 2013**

The Gates County Board of Commissioners met in Regular Session at 10:00 a.m. Wednesday, September 4, 2013 in the Commissioners Board Room, 202 Court Street, Gatesville. Commissioners Jordan, Owens, Hora, and Hofler were present. Also present was County Manager, Jon Mendenhall. Commissioner Kenneth Jernigan was absent from the meeting

Chairman Jordan led in prayer and the pledge of allegiance.

Chairman Jordan called the meeting to order.

Approval of Minutes

Commissioner Owens made a motion to approve the August 7, 2013 Board of Commissioners Meeting Minutes, the August 14, 2013 Board of Commissioners Meeting Minutes and to correct the August 12, 2013 Board of Commissioners Special Meeting Minutes by changing the name Linda Vaughn to Debra Vaughn on page 1300. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Approval of Agenda

Commissioner Hora made a motion to adjust the agenda to add Vd1 to discuss the funding for the Pasquotank County District Attorney's office and 11A6 Personnel to the closed session agenda. Commissioner Hofler seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Delegations – Unannounced

Earl Rountree, Sunbury, attended the Pasquotank County Commissioner's Meeting to address the withholding of funds for the DA's office in Elizabeth City. He defended Gates County's position to withdraw funds for the DA's office. He questioned why Gates County was singled out and Currituck and Chowan County were not mentioned for withdrawing funds. Mr. Rountree supports County Manager, Jon Mendenhall's, position to withdraw funds.

Delegations – Announced

Mr. Bob Carruth, NC Association of County Commissioners, presented the NCACC Risk Management 2013 Workers' Compensation Pool Award to Gates County for having recorded the lowest number of claims per \$1million in payroll among all small county members.

Administrative Reports

Jon Mendenhall, County Manager, presented the July Administrative Report. He stated that over the past month Gates County has worked on the sharing of services with the School Board and anticipate a joint staff meeting on September 16, 2013. Economic development progress has been made and meetings are scheduled in Edenton with the Northeast Commission. Mr. Mendenhall attended the NCACC Annual Conference and the Ad-hoc Animal Welfare Advisory Committee is still meeting. Gates County Government is currently working on economic development and utility consolidation. Meetings are scheduled with the Rural Planning Ordination and the Albemarle RC&D. Projects that are still in progress are the Library Project, Sanitary Sewer Project P1, and Sanitary Sewer Project P2. The bid process for the courthouse renovation has also began and is currently still in progress.

Chairman Jordan asked if we had heard from Grant Administrator, Mike Scott of and Mr. Mendenhall confirmed that we have not heard from Mike Scott but have received information that needs to be reviewed by the County Attorney to make sure we are comfortable confirming some of the commitments.

Renee McGinnis, Tax Administrator, presented the July Tax Collector's Report. Mrs. McGinnis called attention to the discoveries section and mentioned that the 15

discoveries have a total tax value of \$2,637,833. County Tax Services, Inc. is paid 28% of the discovery at the time the tax is paid. The tax office is still working on reconciling statements.

Commissioner Owens questioned the Gatesville Town line item. Mrs. McGinnis confirmed that the amount listed is the full amount. She also explained that the county is not paying any fees associated with tax and tag renewals at this time. The first three months fees are paid from the account holding the 3% interest received from delinquent motor vehicle payments and contributed to the State by the Counties.

Commissioner Hora asked how we can keep track of the change in vehicle tax values. Mrs. McGinnis stated that they are working on a spreadsheet to track vehicle tax changes and the information will hopefully be in place by next month to analyze in greater detail.

Chairman Jordan noticed that there are zero collections for Travis Ellis and asked what the current number of foreclosures are. Chairman Jordan also asked if we were planning to let him keep the properties or to buy them back. Mrs. McGinnis stated that there are currently about 18-20 foreclosures and she can provide information for review to determine letting him keep them or purchasing back.

Commissioner Owens asked if we will always show 10 years of delinquent tax. Mrs. McGinnis stated that the statute of limitations requires ten years but does not allow for collection after ten years.

Chairman Jordan asked about bringing a License Plate Agency into the county. Mrs. McGinnis stated that she is in favor of bringing a LPA to the county because the LPA is contracted and the fees that we are currently paying for transactions would come back to the county. The private contractor would be the one to benefit from profits of the LPA but the county would benefit from the taxes collected from the LPA and it would create a good one stop shop for citizens.

Commissioner Owens stated that there isn't a lot of incentive for a current contractor to start a location in Gates County because it would require the contractor to rent a building and hire more employees. A current contractor in a neighboring county is already servicing at least ½ of Gates County Citizens.

Chairman Jordan asked for Mrs. McGinnis to prepare some information on bringing an LPA to the county by next month.

Jon Mendenhall, County Manager, stated that the reorganization in financial services and development services is complete.

Tim Hedgepeth, Water Department Supervisor, explained that the reports are a little different this month but the water department has no major concerns.

Chairman Jordan asked about the purchased sources on the water usage report and if it is on the correct form. Mr. Hedgepeth confirmed that the report is universal so that it can service multiple counties and the amount is on the correct form.

Chairman Jordan explained the actions taken by the county manager to stop the funding to Pasquotank County for the DA's office and asked the board to take action to put closure on the situation.

Commissioner Hofler stated that she agrees that Mr. Mendenhall took the right action to stop funding due to other counties not paying their part and due to the fact that we have facilities here in the county for the DA.

Commissioner Hora feels that Pasquotank benefits by the DA living in Pasquotank and until a formula is created to evaluate time spent in each county, space provided and the benefits to each county Gates County should not make the payment.

Chairman Jordan acknowledged the general statute and stated that we are meeting all statute requirements.

Commissioner Owens suspects that the space we provide is only used on court dates and also feels that Mr. Mendenhall was correct to withhold payment to Pasquotank for the DA's office.

Commissioner Hofler made a motion to support the decision of the County Manager to withhold funds from Pasquotank. Commissioner Hora seconded motion, motion passed without opposition.

New Business

Sandy Pittman, Finance Officer, presented budget amendments 8 and 9 as follows:

Budget Amendment #8 Shared Services Solid Waste Equipment

Budget Amendment #9 accounting for additional revenue and allocating funds to the CIP.

Commissioner Hofler asked if the purchase of waste containers would include recycling. Mrs. Pittman confirmed that recycling will be available for the schools.

Commissioner Owens asked what the school systems waste cost was for last year. Mr. Mendenhall explained that last year the schools were taking waste to the convenient center and then the county was absorbing the travel cost. The new system will be different from the old system and will allow for expenses to be better allocated to the county and to the school board. The County will be billed for the entire amount and then will bill the Gates County School System for half of the amount.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to approve budget amendment 8. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.

Commissioner Owens asked for County Manager, Jon Mendenhall, to provide greater details on budget amendment 9. Mr. Mendenhall reviewed accounting for additional revenue and allocating funds to the Capital Improvement Program Fund.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to approve budget amendment 9 and to close out the Library Project. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.

Mr. Mendenhall presented a request to hold a public hearing on an ordinance amending the text of the zoning ordinance to allow Cellular Towers in Certain Districts by Special Use Permit in A-1 Zoning districts on September 16, 2013.

Commissioner Hofler made a motion to schedule a public hearing on September 16, 2013 to discuss an ordinance amending text of the zoning ordinance to allow Cellular Towers in Certain Districts by Special Use Permit in A-1 Zoning districts. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Mr. Mendenhall presented a request to hold a public hearing on September 16, 2013 at 7 p.m. for an ordinance amending the text of the zoning ordinance to allow Solar Farms by Special Use Permit in A-1 zoning districts and by right in I-1 zoning districts with supplemental standards.

Commissioner Hofler asked to see neighboring county requirements. Mr. Mendenhall stated that the information can be provided via email to the Board.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to schedule a public hearing on September 16, 2013 to discuss an ordinance amending the text of the zoning ordinance to allow Solar Farms by Special Use Permit in A-1 zoning districts and by right in I-1 zoning districts with supplemental standards. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Comments:

Ann Howell, Eure District, asked if a copy of the nuisance ordinance would be available to the public. Chairman Jordan confirmed that the nuisance ordinance will be added to the website.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to enter into closed session according to NCGS 143-318.11 (3) (4). Commissioner Hofler seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.

Commissioner Hora made a motion to exit closed session and enter into regular session. Commissioner Hofler seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.

Commissioner Hofler made a motion to authorize the board to draft an economic development commission. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.

Commissioner Hora made a motion to authorize the signing of a letter to the Governor as discussed in closed session to request DOT to put a stop light at the US 13/NC137. Commissioner Owens seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to authorize the county manager to put the vehicle that was listed to be surplused back into the fleet. Commissioner Hofler seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.

No additional comments by the board.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Hora seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.


