

**GATES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS  
REGULAR MEETING MINUTES  
MAY 7, 2014**

The Gates County Board of Commissioners met in Regular Session at 10:00 a.m. Wednesday, May 7, 2014 in the Main Court Room, 202 Court Street, Gatesville. Commissioners Jordan, Owens, Hofler, and Felton were present. Also present was Interim County Manager, Kenneth Windley.

Chairman Jordan led in prayer and the pledge of allegiance.

Chairman Jordan called the meeting to order.

**Approval of Minutes**

Commissioner Owens made a motion to approve the minutes as amended for March 24, 2014, April 2, 2014 and April 21, 2014. Commissioner Felton seconded the motion, motion carried unanimously.

**Approval of Agenda**

Chairman Jordan stated that the agenda needs to be amended by adding (9) Proposed Amendments to the Gates County Water Billing Policy & (10) Budget Amendment 33 for Cooperative Extension under New Business.

Commissioner Hofler made a motion to approve the agenda as amended. Commissioner Felton seconded the motion, motion carried unanimously.

**Delegations – Unannounced**

Doug Bailey, Ad-Hoc Animal Welfare Committee, addressed the Board in regards to the 13 recommendations that were presented to the Commissioners on behalf of the Ad-Hoc Animal Welfare Committee. Mr. Bailey stated that in May of 2013 there was an Ad-Hoc Animal Advisory Committee formed to make recommendations on the animal control ordinance of 2009. Starting in July recommendations were given to the Board that addressed language, definitions, animal cruelty investigators, impounding of large animals, petition of forfeiture and various other topics. Recommendation number 12 can be deleted from the recommendation. Mr. Bailey stated that the final recommendations were given to the Board in November of 2013 and has not heard back from the Board on any of the topics.

Chairman Jordan stated that he is not sure at this time why the recommendations have not been addressed and not sure of the circumstances of why the previous county manager has not presented the items to the Board. The Board will take a further look and be prepared to discuss the items at the May 19<sup>th</sup> or June 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting.

Mr. Bailey asked if items can be changed prior to the new fiscal year if they do not affect the budget. Mr. Bailey stated that it is very frustrating that it has been almost 10 months and no actions have been taken, this is why citizens do not volunteer to serve on committees.

Lorin Wiggins, Carter Road, Hobbsville, stated that he is here to speak about the zoning issue. Chairman Jordan stated that a public hearing will be held later in the meeting on the zoning issue.

**Delegations – Announced**

Reba Green-Holley, Cooperative Extension Director, explained that every year the Governor recognizes outstanding volunteers that have been nominated from across the state. Each year organizations in the county are encouraged to nominate outstanding volunteers to represent Gates County. One of the categories that you can nominate a volunteer for is Youth Volunteerism. Xavier Roscoe, an avid 4her, was nominated to go forward and was selected in a group of only 20 that the Governor invites to be recognized. Ms. Holley presented Mr. Roscoe with the Governor's Volunteer Medallion Award.

Ms. Holley stated that Cooperative Extension is celebrating its Centennial Birthday this year by conducting an open house, tree planting, and various presentations. The tree planting will be held at 3pm today at the Gates County Library. Ms. Holley asked the Board to move to approve the Centennial Celebration Proclamation.

Chairman Jordan read the last statements of the proclamation:

Therefore, be it resolved, that the Gates County Board of Commissioners:  
Recognizes the significance of the Smith-Lever Act to the establishment of Cooperative Extension nationwide.

Encourages the people of Gates County to observe and celebrate the centennial with a focus on congratulating the accomplishments of the past 100 years and ensuring a thriving future for Cooperative Extension.

Honors the local Extension Agents and university faculty who dedicate careers to providing trusted education to help people, families, youth, businesses and communities solve problems, develop skills and build a better future.

Thanks Cooperative Extension volunteers who provide thousands of hours to promote excellence for 4-H, Master Gardeners, family and consumer sciences and other programs in their communities.

Encourages continued collaboration and cooperation among federal, state and local governments to ensure Cooperative Extension's sustainability as the nation's premiere non-formal educational network.

Celebrates millions of youth, adults, families, farmers, community leaders and others who engage in Cooperative Extension learning opportunities designed to extend knowledge and change lives.

Commissioner Hofler made a motion to approve the North Carolina Cooperative Extension Gates County Centennial Proclamation. Commissioner Felton seconded the motion, motion passed unanimously.

#### **Administrative Reports**

Ken Windley, Interim County Manager, presented the April County Manager's Report. Mr. Windley stated that a leak has been discovered at the Gatesville Water Tank and will need to be repaired; some work to the fencing and cutting back of trees will also need to take place. Department meetings about the budget have taken place and a few job descriptions have been reviewed and updated. We have been attending the Comprehensive Transportation Planning Committee meetings. A big project we have been working on is the modifications to the sewer capacity that are needed for the assisted living facility at Merchants Commerce Center. We have been conducting weekly staff meetings and the County Manager is continuing to serve in the place of a county planner for the Board of Adjustment and the Planning Board. There was a 911 Grant meeting in Raleigh that was attended by the County Manager and Billy Winn. Improvements are still in progress for the Historic Courthouse.

There were no questions for the County Manager.

Commissioner Hofler asked about several of the departments that are running over budget. Ms. Pittman stated there were several departments that will be presented in June for budget amendments. Commissioner Hofler asked why the unemployment line item is over budget. Ms. Pittman explained that it is partly because of a transition in the system. The state used to pay out the benefits and they would bill us, they have transitioned to a system where we pay 1% of every salary. We have received the final bill and will be closing out the transition year. It should not be a problem for years going forward.

Commissioner Owens verified that all final amendments would be ready to be presented in June.

Chairman Jordan asked why several departments are over on phone & postage. Ms. Pittman explained that there were several telephone lines that were cut and we have a contract with century link that we have to pay. We were hoping by now that we would have updated our phone system and have signed a new contract.

Mrs. Renee McGinnis, Tax Administrator, presented the collectors report to the Board and called attention to the collection rate on the annual bills which is a little lower than it was last year, the office is working to send out another notice at the end of this week. The overall collection rate is higher than where it was last year because of the motor vehicles.

Chairman Jordan asked about Travis Ellis. Ms. McGinnis stated that one invoice has been paid but we are waiting to receive detailed invoices before we pay the remaining amount which is about \$3,600.

Ms. Harrell presented two requests for tax refunds to the Board.

Commissioner Felton made a motion to approve the tax refund for Joseph W. Odom for \$434.00 and the refund for Monica Myers Britt for \$119.62. Commissioner Hofler seconded the motion, motion passed unanimously.

Chairman Jordan stated that there is a letter in the packet that details that the URP Grant for the Housing Committee was not granted this year. The County Manager has had a phone conversation with the grant agency on why we were not selected and will be outlining these items in a memo that will go out today.

There were no other departmental questions.

#### **Public Hearings**

Commissioner Owens made a motion to enter a Public Hearing on Zoning Amendment ZA 14-5, a request by William P. Rountree to rezone Parcels 07-00441, 10-03109, 10-03083, 10-03084, 07-00745, 10-03108, 10-02864, 07-00802, 10-03107, 10-02782 from A-1 to RMH-1. Commissioner Hofler seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.

Lorin Wiggins, Carter Road, Hobbsville, stated that the zoning matter is not the issue, the issue that he has is that he owns property at the end of the road and he feels that the NC Department of Transportation will want to improve the non-paved road if the property is zoned for manufactured housing. If the road is improved significantly the first thing that will happen is that he will lose land and then his taxes will increase.

William Rountree, Carters Road, Gatesville, stated that the purpose of the request was not intended to hurt anyone. He owns a lot that has been approved for a special use permit and there is another lot that Mr. Jesse Duck owns that he would have to go through the special use permit process if he decided to put a house on the land. Mr. Rountree explained that after getting involved in the process he wanted to make sure that residents were able to put mobile homes back on their property if something should happen to their residence. He stated that he has recently learned that the ordinance has been replaced. In regards to the roads, he respects Mr. Wiggins's opinion but the state is going to pave it when they decide they have the money and want to push the issue. The only person that has expressed opposition was Mr. Ron Kirkland which was a misunderstanding. The misunderstanding was over a ditch and has been taken care of. The area is not going to be developed; the zoning is just for the existing residents.

Chuck Brothers, Vice-Chairman, Planning Board, stated that Mr. Kirkland did present to the Planning Board the first time but did not have any issues the second time the issue was before the Planning Board. Mr. Brother called Mr. Lee Padrick with community development in Little Washington for his opinion. Based on the percentages of the structure there it should be rezoned.

Doris Smith, Gatesville, stated that everyone feels the same and they don't want the land rezoned because they are afraid that they will lose part of their land.

Commissioner Hofler made a motion to exit the Public Hearing on Zoning Amendment ZA 14-5, a request by William P. Rountree to rezone Parcels 07-00441, 10-03109, 10-03083, 10-03084, 07-00745, 10-03108, 10-02864, 07-00802, 10-03107, 10-02782 from A-1 to RMH-1. Commissioner Owens seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.

Chairman Jordan stated that when the request originally came before the board, the issue was that it would be spot zoning so the Board instructed the review of rezoning multiple properties to avoid spot zoning. The Board has heard from those that are for it and those that are against it and property owners have been notified and now we have to make a decision. Chairman Jordan did take a moment to state that DOT will not take the right-of-way without the landowner donating the property. The Board must look at it as what is best for the County and what will be considered an improvement for the County.

Commissioner Owens asked Mr. Brothers to expand on the information that was obtained by Mr. Lee Padrick. Mr. Brothers stated Mr. Padrick went before the planning board several time for training and he has spoken on issues similar to this one with the Planning Board. There are 10 parcels that are either single wide, vacant, or double wide. He asked Mr. Padrick if the general rule of thumb is dictated by the majority of what is present. Mr. Padrick informed Mr. Brothers that he was correct and that the majority does provide the ruling for the zoning.

Commissioner Hofler verified that we are only making a ruling on the 10 specific parcels on the east side of the road.

Commissioner Felton stated that he has heard from several residents that are not in favor of the rezoning and commended Mr. Rountree on his efforts to correct the zoning. Commissioner Felton stated that he realizes this is legal but feels that there is an ethical dilemma for one person to request rezoning for another individuals property.

Mr. Brothers stated that the starting application was for the Rountree property only but after review it seems that it is applicable to rezone the other properties. The Planning Board reviewed the ten parcels after the Commissioners sent it back and there were no comments by any citizens or the property owner.

Chairman Jordan stated that one of the concerns of property owners is that they may lose land and if the information that has been provided to us remains to be true then it states that property cannot be taken to widen a road without land owner consent.

Chairman Jordan stated that when we can be proactive with rezoning to relieve issues that will come before land owners in the future then it is a good thing and the Board is doing there job. Chairman Jordan stated that he is in favor of the rezoning.

Mr. Rountree stated that everywhere we go we drive on pavement that has been given up and sacrificed at one given time. When they widen a road they put a 50 ft. right-of-way and reconstruct the ditches, but this isn't the issue that has been brought forward.

Dan Bazemore, Hall Township, stated that years ago before we had zoning we had a Planning Board and went through a number of meetings and discussed a number of issues where the public was misinformed. Information was held back from the public and the people that were in charge of the office requested many individuals to be fired from their position because the truth was not being given to the public. In accordance to the Information Action the public could request information, when the information was received it was found that information was not communicated. The issue is that things should be right before it is put in effect and we need to stop this putting stuff in place and then trying to correct it at the end. At that time, those with 10 or more acres could go before and could get the zoning they requested and it would not be considered spot zoning. Some people with 70 acres requested land to be zoned commercial and was told it would be zoned but it still has not been zoned commercial. This same gentleman is in suit with the state because they have not paid him for his property. According to the rules 10 or more acres is not considered spot zoning and should have been zoned RMH-1 in the very beginning instead of A-1. Mr. Bazemore asked if the County flopped by not making sure it was rezoned correctly at the beginning. We have to look at what we are dealt with

today and have to look at how to make it right. The property owners at that time could have come before the Board to change the RMH-1 zoning. Mr. Bazemore encouraged the Board to look at what should have been done to start with to make their decision.

Chairman Jordan stated that any decision made is made in the best interest of the County and may not be popular with everyone. When we leave at the end of the day we need to do what we feel is best. What we were looking at is rezoning the area to make it better for those that come behind us. The issues of taking property have been addressed and to Mr. Bazemore's point we have to right a wrong and the Board should be ready to move forward with making a motion to address the zoning request. The application and fee has been submitted, the notices have been given, comments have been provided and now we are at a point where we have to make a decision.

Ken Windley, Interim County Manager stated that DOT cannot condemn secondary roads.

Commissioner Owens stated that Mr. Wiggins was not in opposition but had a concern, Ms. Smith had a concern that she may lose some of her acreage and now we have information about DOT condemning secondary roads. Commissioner Owens stated that we have dealt with the concerns and thanked Mr. Rountree for his request.

Commissioner Hofler stated that there are some problems with the planning and the zoning and some areas that need to be corrected. Commissioner Hofler stated that it isn't zoned incorrectly because mobile homes can be allowed with a special use permit.

Commissioner Felton stated that he does not have a problem with the request his only issue is that it is legal for one individual to request changes to another person's property.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to approve Zoning Amendment 14-5, a request by William P. Rountree to rezone Parcels 07-00441, 10-03109, 10-03083, 10-03084, 07-00745, 10-03108, 10-02864, 07-00802, 10-03107, 10-02782 from A-1 to RMH-1. Commissioner Hofler seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.

### **Old Business**

Ken Windley, Interim County Manager, presented to the Board the Personnel Committee Recommendations on flex time, Veteran's Holiday, and the Christmas Holiday Schedule. The Personnel Committee Recommendations were as follows:

1. Flex Time Policy- Currently the policy requires flex time earned to be used within the month it's earned. If it's earned at a busy time the end of a month, the employee usually never gets to use it. The Committee voted to recommend that if flex time is earned in one pay period (month), it must be used by the end of the next pay period (month). For example, if flex time is earned in March it must be used by April 30 or it is lost.
2. Veterans Day Holiday- The Committee voted to recommend that the Personnel Ordinance be formally amended to include this holiday.
3. Christmas Holiday- The current policy allows for three days off but does not clarify which ones. The Committee voted to use the same holiday schedule as the State except when the State does not provide for three days off. When Christmas falls on:

4. Nathan Riddick is the Senior Facilities Technician with five years' experience. He recently informed me that Chowan County was recruiting him and offering

about a \$3,000 pay increase. I checked and the starting salary was \$24,750. Not wanting to lose a valuable employee, I investigated the starting salaries of similar positions in the counties used in the pay plan.

Gates County	\$22,089 (5 years)
Rowan County	\$28,000 (5 years)
Perquimans County	\$25,000 (5 years)
Stanly County	\$24,987 (9 years)
Chowan County	\$24,750 (5 years)

The Committee recommends Nathan be moved from Grade 12, Step 1, to Grade 14, Step 2 (\$24,886) which should be the Grade for this position.

Commissioner Hofler made a motion to approve the flex time, Veteran's Day Holiday, Christmas Schedule, and salary increase for Nathan Riddick to move to Grade 14, Step 2. Commissioner Owens seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.

#### **New Business**

Ken Windley, Interim County Manager, explained to the Board that the Board of Education wants a short term lease at the old prison facility to be used as a temporary practice field for high school and middle school football and soccer teams. The lease would last from May 15, 2014 to September 15, 2014. The Board of Education would hold the County harmless for any injuries or other problems. Any seeding or grading would be the responsibility of the lessee. Any other improvement would have to be authorized by the County Manager. The lease dates allows time for the leased field to have some work done and enough time for their permanent field to have work completed.

Commissioner Hofler asked for clarification on the exact location at the prison facility that will be used. Mr. Windley stated that it will be the old prison softball field that will be used.

Commissioner Felton made a motion to approve a short term lease with the School Board from May 15, 2014 to September 15, 2014 for a practice field at the old prison site. Commissioner Hofler seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.

Chairman Jordan stated that Mr. Horton sent each of the Board members his request for approval of the Resolution. The Board addressed the issue and showed favor in the past but has not formally adopted a resolution. The Resolution asks for Congressional action to take place.

Commissioner Hofler made a motion to approve the Resolution in Support of Recognition of "WW II Coastwise Merchant Mariners". Commissioner Felton seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.

Ken Windley, Interim County Manager, presented the following proposed amendments to the Gates County Water Billing Policy.

- a. Have a call list put together on the date of the late penalty. For a fee of about \$0.10 each, a Robo-Call taped message can be sent to available phone numbers reminding them of the cutoff in five days. Code Red can also be used.
- b. You may want to consider rewarding good customers with a roll-over of their bill. If a customer has a perfect record for the previous 12 months of paying their water bill and their payment is not made, roll over the bill to the next month (with the late fee still due).
- c. Currently there are 5 days between the due date and the cut-off of water. This can be expanded to 10 days in an effort to give customers more time. The cut-offs would begin on day 11.

Commissioner Hofler asked how hard it will be to determine if someone has had a perfect record for 12 months. Mr. Windley stated that this is not a difficult task and can be found easily. Commissioner Owens asked if we currently have the ability to get that type of

report. Ms. Pittman stated that the software has recently been upgraded and there are more reporting capabilities that should allow us to access that type of report.

Chairman Jordan asked how many cutoffs we had before the new system was in place. Ms. Pittman stated that it would start at about 100 and then after some calls and late arrivals we would cut off around 40 or just a little more. This change would help those that have lost bills in the mail, are out of town, or just have a slip up but are typically good customers.

Commissioner Felton made a motion to approve the proposed amendments A & B to the Gates County Water Billing Policy to be effective June 1, 2014 and amendment C to be effective immediately. Commissioner Hofler seconded the motion, motion passed unanimously.

Sandy Pittman, Finance Director, presented Budget Amendment 33 for Cooperative Extension to the Board. Additional funding has been received from the Grant and if it is not spent prior to the spending cutoff at the end of May the money has to be sent back to the funding agency. There are no county dollars or matching required.

Commissioner Hofler made a motion to approve Budget Amendment 33 for Cooperative Extension. Commissioner Owens seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.

Renee McGinnis, stated that when action was taken by the Board to run waterlines down Rountree Lane, it has never been addressed at all in the current policy but is buried in commissioner meeting minutes. There were changes that were made that were never brought forward and put into existing policies. Over the last few years there have been policies that administrations have put in place that future administrations will never have information on. Changes are also not always communicated to Department Heads.

Commissioner Felton says that he has heard from some businesses that they say that this is the hardest county they have ever done business in to get things going.

Mr. Windley stated that a lot of these issues can be solved when a new planner is hired.

#### **Citizen Comments**

Ashley Taylor, asked if anything has been changed for the number of homes that can be placed on a private road. Commissioner Felton stated that the limit of homes may be outlined by the amount of road footage available. Commissioner Owens stated that it could also be depending on a minor or major subdivision.

#### **Commissioner Comments**

Commissioner Owens thanked the community for their support of yesterday's election and would like to congratulate everyone that was involved in the election. Mr. Owens stated that he is excited for another term on the Board.

Commissioner Hofler thanked everyone for attending and listening to the business of the County. Commissioner Hofler congratulated everyone that won in the elections and thanked everyone that ran and took time out to vote. As a County we could improve our voter turnout and hopefully we will in the future. This weekend is Mother's Day and it is important to thank and remember your mothers.

Commissioner Felton thanked everyone for attending and for voting. There were several races that were very close and it shows how important it is for everyone to vote.

Chairman Jordan thanked citizens for attending and wished everyone a Happy Mother's Day.

Chairman Jordan stated that he received a letter from one of the citizens that a complaint has been submitted to the Chief Clerk at the NC Utilities Commission RE: Docket No. SP-3353, SUB 0, Application of Sunbury McCoy Lane Solar, LLC. The concern is about the facility being built close to residence and would create noise pollution and reduce property values.

**Closed Session**

Commissioner Hofler made a motion to enter into closed session pursuant to NCGS 143-318.11 a (3) Legal, (4) Economic Development, (5) Real Estate. Commissioner Owens seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.

Commissioner Felton made a motion to exit closed session. Commissioner Hofler seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to authorize the County Manager and Chairman to submit the preliminary grant application for Sunbury School as discussed in closed session to the Department of Commerce. Commissioner Hofler seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

**Adjournment**

Commissioner Felton made a motion adjourn. Commissioner Owens seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.
