

**GATES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
REGULAR MEETING MINUTES
AUGUST 6, 2014**

The Gates County Board of Commissioners met in Regular Session at 10:00 a.m. Wednesday, August 6, 2014 in the Main Court Room, 202 Court Street, Gatesville. Commissioners Jordan, Owens, Jernigan, Hofler, and Felton were present. Also present was County Manager, Natalie Rountree.

Chairman Jordan led in prayer and the pledge of allegiance.

Chairman Jordan called the meeting to order.

Approval of Minutes

Commissioner Owens made a motion to approve the minutes as modified for July 2, 2014 & July 21, 2014. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion; motion carried unanimously.

Approval of Agenda

Chairman Jordan stated that the agenda needs to be amended to add the Personnel Board recommendation for the interim Clerk to the Board to be appointed as the permanent Clerk to the Board under new business.

Commissioner Hofler made a motion to approve the agenda as adjusted. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.

Delegations – Unannounced

Reba Green-Holley, Cooperative Extension Director, reminded the Board that today is the annual report to the people at 1pm in the Extension Auditorium. Ms. Holley also announced that she is retiring effective October 31, 2014. There will be a retirement luncheon held on October 23, 2014.

Administrative Reports

Natalie Rountree, County Manager, stated that most of July was spent learning about what has taken place over the past few years and learning about current projects. Since July 1, meetings have been held with Finance, Tax, Development Services, Water, Building and Grounds, Register of Deeds, Clerk of Court, Emergency Services, Soil Conservation, Social Services, and GITS. Ms. Rountree has also met with Dr. Williams, Lulu Eure & Kermit Nixon in regards to the tennis courts and quotes for repairs. There were Comprehensive Transportation Plan meeting, Planning Board, and Board of Adjustment meetings held. Ms. Rountree stated that the County Planner position has been advertised and review of applications will begin August 18th. The Tri-County Animal Shelter is interested in the concrete building but they may not be able to move it for about a year. Municipal Engineering has been taking soil samples at the potential spray field and is expected to file an application with DENR by the end of July. Ms. Rountree stated that she has also submitted a response for Project Mokaya and is waiting to hear how they make their site selection. Andrus & Company began work on the Old Courthouse and to date the horizontal I-beams have been installed under the 2nd floor of the west wing. Construction should take about 4 weeks.

Chairman Jordan stated that Commissioner Felton may be a good commissioner to have sitting in on the County Planner interviews. Fulfilling the Animal Shelter Request to wait a year on the building is quite a bit of time. Commissioner Owens stated that he would recommend contacting the animal shelter and giving them a time frame to move the building. Ms. Rountree stated that she has spoken to Dana at the shelter and the reason for the delay is that where they anticipate putting the building they are waiting on some other buildings to arrive and would like to move everything at one time. They are also looking into the costs associated with moving the building. Chairman Jordan stated that

30 or 60 days would be a reasonable time frame to give them before putting it on govdeals. Commissioner Owens verified that emergency management has no use for the building. Commissioner Owens stated that he would be ok notifying the animal shelter that they have first choice of the building for the next 30-60 days and then it will be placed on govdeals. Commissioner Jernigan stated that if they want a building bad enough they will figure out a way to go ahead and move it. Chairman Jordan directed the County Manager to contact the animal shelter and let them know that we need a decision made by the September Board of Commissioner meeting.

There were no other questions for the County Manager.

Commissioner Owens asked Ms. Pittman why some of the expenditure lines look over budgeted. Ms. Pittman stated that some of the total expenditures look over budgeted because the reimbursements from other funds have not been posted yet. Once these are posted the budgets will no longer appear overspent.

Ms. Renee McGinnis, Tax Administrator, presented to the Board the tax collectors report for July 2014. There is nothing out of the norm to report for the collectors report, the current tax bills have been sent out. Ms. McGinnis stated that there is a charge for the tax collector to collect the outlined taxes and fees in the packet. Chairman Jordan read the charge that will be issued to Ms. McGinnis, Tax Administrator:

To the Collector of the County of Gates
State of North Carolina
County of Gates

You are hereby authorized, empowered, and commanded to collect the taxes set forth in the tax records filed in the office of the Tax Assessor and/or Collector and in the tax receipts herewith delivered to you, in the amounts and from the taxpayers likewise therein set forth. Such taxes are hereby declared to be the first lien upon all real property of the respective taxpayers in the County of Gates, and this order shall be a full and sufficient authority to direct, require and enable you to levy on and sell any real or personal property of such taxpayers, for and on account thereof, in accordance with law, NCGS 105-321(b).

Witness my hand and official seal, this the 6th day of August, 2014.

Chairman Jordan verified that the charge is effective for Ms. McGinnis and the new tax administrator.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to issue the tax collectors charge to Ms. McGinnis. Commissioner Hofler seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.

Ms. Gwen Harrell, Deputy Tax Collector, presented to the Board the request for refund for Mr. Carlton Matthews for 145.47.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to approve the refund for Mr. Carlton Matthews for \$145.47. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion; motion passed unanimously.

Chairman Jordan stated that the Board has discussed providing some forgiveness for good customers that may miss a payment and asked Ms. Pittman where the department is on implementing this. Ms. Pittman stated that to her knowledge the office has implemented this policy and a good customer is considered one that has paid twelve months in a row of payments on time. Commissioner Owens stated that the Board has been receiving phone calls about water bills and cutoffs. Commissioner Jernigan asked if the computer generates the information to be considered a good customer or if it is being checked manually. Ms. Pittman stated that they are checking it manually, our system is not generating the information. It is not as easy as it appears to be. Commissioner Owens asked that the Board ask Sandy and Natalie to look into the possibility of upgrading the system so that it is capable of generating the information. Commissioner Owens stated that there has been conversation about certain accounts being declared

special if there are medical needs so that the water is not cut off. It may be that the account number is adjusted with a letter or number at the end to identify that it is a special account that needs to be checked on further. Commissioner Jernigan stated that hopefully the ability to pay online may reduce the number of cutoffs. Chairman Jordan stated that we may need to look to other personnel to cross reference the list while we are getting things worked out.

New Business

Ms. Renee McGinnis presented to the Board a request to surplus the obsolete office equipment. The equipment has been replaced over the years and has just been piled up for a while. Mr. Curry, with IT, has gone through the equipment and salvaged some parts that may be used at a later time. The request is to surplus the remainder.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to surplus the Tax Office obsolete equipment. Commissioner Hofler seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.

Ms. Sandy Pittman presented to the Board a Budget Amendment for the SHIIP Grant. Ms. Pittman stated that there was an additional \$80 to carry forward after figures were finalized.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to approve the Budget Amendment for the SHIIP Grant. Commissioner Hofler seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.

Chairman Jordan stated that the Board needs to discuss the mold and the relocation of the GEMS program. Chairman Jordan asked if there are plans to remove the mold in the building. Natalie Rountree, County Manager, stated that the process would be up for discussion, there was a professional mold assessment conducted in 2013 and in April of 2014 there was a message sent to the Board of Commissioners requesting temporary relocation for GEMS to be moved to the mental health building. The HVAC has been worked on and the mental health building is ready to be moved into. We do not know a timeline at this point until we have a professional to look and make a determination. We have \$10,000 budgeted to start the process. Chairman Jordan stated that it is a historic building and we will need to look at the amount of funds needed for the renovation.

Commissioner Hofler stated that we can probably get some community help to help move GEMS to another facility. There are several church and service groups that would probably be willing to assist to reduce moving costs. Commissioner Jernigan asked Ms. Beasley if there is an estimate of how many truckloads of stuff is in storage. Ms. Beasley stated that she was not aware. Commissioner Owens stated that we will need to make sure that the new location is properly advertised.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to authorize the County Manager to move forward the relocation of GEMS. Commissioner Hofler seconded the motion, motion passed unanimously.

Ms. Sandy Pittman presented to the Board a recommendation to amend the FY 15 Budget Ordinance. Ms. Pittman stated that this portion of the Budget Ordinance to require organization that receive \$5,000 or more to submit an audited financial statement. Ms. Pittman stated that this requirement provides a hardship to some of the committees such as the housing committee. Chairman Jordan stated that to bring in an outside auditing firm for such a small amount of money creates a hardship for the committee. Commissioner Owens stated that some of these groups receive grants which are auditing their paperwork as well.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to approve the amendment to the budget ordinance eliminating the submission of audited financial statements. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.

The approved change to the Budget Ordinance reads as follows:

All agencies that are not part of county government and receive county funding are required to submit financial statements to the county each year. Approved payments may be delayed pending receipt of this financial information.

Chairman Jordan stated that the Personnel Board met this morning and would like to recommend that the Interim Clerk to the Board be appointed as the full time Clerk to the Board.

Commissioner Hofler made a motion to appoint Melissa Coe as the Clerk to the Board. Commissioner Owens seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.

Citizen Comments

Commissioner Comments

Commissioner Owens thanked everyone for attending the meeting. He stated that he has received quite a few citizen phone calls and appreciates hearing directly from citizens.

Commissioner Jernigan thanked everyone for attending and stated that school will be starting soon and a lot of people are finishing up vacations now so hopefully we will have more in attendance at the next meeting.

Commissioner Hofler thanked everyone for attending and stated that it is nice to see and hear from citizens of the County. Hearing from citizens helps everyone to do their job and to move forward.

Commissioner Felton thanked everyone for attending and thanked department heads for the precise reports that are given.

Chairman Jordan thanked citizens for attending and for providing input in the meeting and stated that he welcomes phone calls. Congressman Butterfield will be at the Gateway Health Center on August 15th at 10:30 a.m., commissioners are invited to attend.

Closed Session

Commissioner Owens made a motion to enter into closed session pursuant to NCGS 143-318.11 a (3) Legal, (6) Personnel. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion passed without opposition.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to exit closed session. Commissioner Hofler seconded the motion, motion carried without opposition.

Adjournment

Commissioner Owens made a motion to authorize the County Attorney and the Chairman to modify the current spray field option to purchase as discussed in closed session and present to the current land owner. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion; motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Hofler made a motion to authorize the Tax Administrator to proceed with the system upgrades. Commissioner Felton seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.

The Board recessed for lunch and the Report to the People with Cooperative Extension. Ms. Reba Green-Holley presented the work that has been completed by the Cooperative Extension staff over the past year. Each Commissioner thanked Ms. Reba Green-Holley for her service to the County and wished her well on her retirement.

Commissioner Felton made a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion, motion passed unanimously.


