

**Gates County Board of Commissioners
Regular Meeting Minutes
May 5, 2008**

The Gates County Board of Commissioners met in regular session on Monday, May 5, 2008, at 10:00 o'clock AM in the County Commissioners' Room, 112 Court Street, Gatesville, NC. Commissioners Pierce, Askew and Jernigan, were present. Also present was Interim County Manager Paul Gregory.

Chairman Pierce called the meeting to order.

Chairman Pierce read a card from the family of Frank Rountree. Mr. Rountree had been a Commissioner for 27 years. A brief history of his service and the changes in the county during his years of service was highlighted. A moment of silence was held and a prayer given by Chairman Pierce in Mr. Rountree's honor.

Commissioner Jernigan made the motion to approve the minutes with the following changes: April 7 Meeting Minutes, name correction from Ben Lang to Dan Lang and name correction from Aaron Smith to Arlen Smith with the right to build. In the April 21 Meeting Minutes, he would like a better explanation of Mr. Gregory's salary. Commissioner Askew seconded. The motion was unanimously approved. A copy of the corrections to be cross-referenced is as follows:

In Minute Book 12, on page 289, in the April 7, 2008 Regular Meeting Minutes, Ben Dan Lang, Gatesville: If something happened to him and his wife they might need to build an addition for assisted living. Mr. Cahoon gave a definition of a lot for clarification and explained how land can be divided to add a second residence.

In Minute Book 12, on page 290, in the April 7, 2008 Regular Meeting Minutes, Aaron Arlen Smith, Eure: Does this mean we can only have one residence per acre? He would like to have the right to build or rent if he wants to.

In Minute Book 12, on page 305, in the April 21, 2008 Special Meeting Minutes, Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to appoint Mr. Paul Gregory as interim manager at a salary of \$3,630.90 per month for three days per week **or \$39.90 per hour**. Commissioner Askew seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Nominations from the Democratic Party: Mrs. Paulette Wester, representing the Democratic Committee which met on May 1. She gave an explanation of the policies and procedures followed by the nomination of Mr. E. Carlton Nickens to replace Commissioner David Brown.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to accept the nomination of the Democratic Party, Commissioner Askew seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

The Democratic Party asked the Board of Commissioners to swear in Mr. Nickens and allow him to participate in this meeting as a full representative.

Nell Wiggins, Clerk of Superior Court, came forward to swear in Mr. Nickens.

Commissioner Nickens thanked the Democratic Party for their nomination and support. He thanked the Board of Commissioners for their support and willingness to help him in his new position. Commissioner Nickens promised the citizens of Gates County that he would work for the benefit and betterment of the County.

Chairman Pierce welcomed Commissioner Nickens. He also stated there was the need to nominate a Vice-Chairman to the Board.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to nominate Commissioner Jernigan as Vice-Chairman, Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Update on the replacement process for Commissioner Rountree: Paulette Wester explained how the replacement of Mr. Rountree will proceed, She has conferred with the State Board of Elections. The State Board recommended that the winner of tomorrow's primary will be awarded the empty seat. Mrs. Wester asked that the Board of Commissioners swear in the winner to fill the vacant seat. A runoff on will be held on June 24th if needed.

Chairman Pierce stated that we could swear in the person at the May 19th meeting, depending on the results of the primary. Commissioner Jernigan thanked Mrs. Wester for all her hard work.

Chairman Pierce introduced Paul Gregory as the Interim County Manager. He served as County Manager for Perquimans County for 17 years and is familiar with Gates County and its programs. He spent 10 years as Department of Social Services Director and 7 years as a school teacher. He is looking forward to being the Interim County Manager, serving the Board and the citizens of Gates County. He will be here Monday through Wednesday, every week. He has an open door policy for everyone and will take all concerns to the Board of Commissioners.

Public Hearing to receive citizens' comments concerning the 2008 CDBG Scattered Site Housing Contract: Three applications were received for the CDBG Contract. Mr. Gregory recommended The Albemarle Commission be awarded the contract based on providing the lowest bid. Sandy Pittman, Finance Officer, read the bids. There were no comments from the Board.

Chairman Pierce opened the floor for public comment. There were no comments from the public. Commissioner Askew made a motion to award the contract to The Albemarle Commission, Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Gregory recommended the Public Hearing be held at the beginning of the June 2, 2008 Commissioners' Meeting. Commissioner Askew made a motion to accept the June 2 date, Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Paul Toti requested an appointment with the Board to discuss zoning concerns. Mr. Toti wanted to discuss the minor subdivision review and process. He gave a recent scenario of a large farm, 300+ acres, and a 200 year old house purchased by a couple through an historical preservation society. They wanted to cut the house and lot out to sell to someone else and keep the rest of the farm intact. Mr. Toti discussed current policies and procedures, a mylar and 15 copies of the maps; then there is a 40 day window to be approved by the county. He is asking that the amount of time to review minor subdivisions to be reduced to 24 to 48 hours for a basic one lot cut out. The current policy creates a burden on citizens to wait 40 days.

Commissioner Askew thanked Mr. Toti for his comments and stated he has been speaking to Randall Cahoon about some issues that have been brought up recently.

Edgar Mitchell has requested an appointment with the Board to discuss ordinances concerning new construction. Mr. Mitchell has been asked by developers to allow waste bins at construction sites. He stated Pasquotank, Camden and Currituck Counties have similar ordinances. Mr. Gregory will look at other county ordinances and work with Mr. Mitchell and come up with a strong ordinance. Hopefully we can work with The Albemarle Commission, in a 10

country area, and develop a strong ordinance that will be enforced. Another issue of concern has been with unlicensed contractors operating in the county. The State has recommended Gates County require tests for unlicensed contractors. If the tests are not passed they will need to get a licensed contractor to do the work. Camden is having a similar problem.

Mr. Mitchell stated that the gym will require a level 3 inspection. Mr. Mitchell stated the Inspections Department needed a higher level of certification. Mr. Mitchell is a level 2.

Commissioner Jernigan expressed the need for a higher level of certification. He has no problem with our Inspections Department getting this. The county is changing and now we have to contract outside of the county for that level of inspection. Mr. Gregory reviewed the agreement of a contract for the high school. Randall Cahoon stated that the contract used has been formally approved by the county's attorney. Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to approve the contract, Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Colleen Turner, Director of the Department of Social Services, welcomed Commissioner Nickens and Paul Gregory. Mrs. Turner noted that May is a busy month. It has been declared Elder Abuse Prevention and Awareness Month, Foster and Adoptive Parent Appreciation Month, and Workforce Development Professionals Recognition Month. Mrs. Turner asked the Board of Commissioners to recognize the above.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to accept May as Elder Abuse Prevention and Awareness Month, Foster and Adoptive Parent Appreciation Month, and Workforce Development Professionals Recognition Month, Commissioner Askew seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Mrs. Turner brought with her silver ribbons. She asked each Commissioner to take one and wear it during the month of May to recognize our elders and the people that work to protect our elders. The Aging and Adult Services Task Force has created a plan, focused on financial issues related to aging and distributing a Home/Community Block Grant funds appropriately. The Task Force is looking at health needs of elders, advocating for health, dental and other services. Also they are looking at the service oriented needs, in home aides; addressing recreational needs, and housing. We also have created a Housing Committee in Gates County. Commissioner Jernigan represents the Commissioners on the Aging Task Force and Commissioner Askew represents the Board on the Housing Committee.

Mrs. Turner discussed Foster Parent and Adoptive Parent Appreciation Month. Gates County has four (4) foster homes, and one (1) child placed in a Perquimans County foster home, recently finalized their first public facilitated adoption which enabled them to receive state dollars to improve foster care and adoption program. Mrs. Turner extended an invitation to the Commissioners to attend the Foster Care and Adoption Appreciation Dinner on Thursday, August 16, at the Tarheel Restaurant; please RSVP to her office.

Mrs. Turner discussed Workforce Development Professionals Month. She has served on the Northeast Workforce Development Board for seven years. The Board and the Elizabeth City Chamber of Commerce will work with us to develop a Chamber of Commerce in Gates County. A private sector representative is needed to sit on that board. Pam Harvey, newly appointed Director at Down East Health Care and Rehabilitation Center has been contacted to serve. She is interested in serving and has agreed to sit on the board representing the health care industry. Mrs. Turner asked the Board to appointment Mrs. Harvey to the Workforce Development Board.

Commissioner Nickens made a motion to appoint Pam Harvey to the Workforce Development board, Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Randall Cahoon, Director of Planning and Development, welcomed both Commissioner Nickens and Paul Gregory. In response to Mr. Toti's question earlier, a 10 day turn around is standard for nearly every ordinance in the region. He stated that at a night meeting in Eure there was discussion about subdivisions. There is a notification process that needs to be adhered to for minor subdivisions. Mr. Cahoon steers and directs the Planning Board, reminds them of laws, ordinances, etc. that must be followed. The Planning Board met on April 15 and would like to request a public hearing date on June 2 from the Commissioners to make two Zoning Ordinance changes. One change is to Section 12.03, and would require 175 feet of road frontage, regardless of road surface materials, for 10 acre "exempt" lots in order to obtain a building permit. Applicants can demonstrate access to a potential building site via a 50 foot radius right of way easement containing a 20 foot wide all weather surfaced private road as long as the road terminates in an ANPA 1144 compliant cul de sac (the cul de sac must have a 50 foot radius, and be surfaced). Lots fronting this cul de sac may have as little as 50 feet of road frontage along the curved periphery of bulb (as allowed in traditional, regulated subdivisions).

Mr. Cahoon reminded the Board that Gates County has been to court with this and it has been defeated, to move forward would involve further court battles.

Mr. Gregory stated that this statute has created problems in all counties, but the county cannot supercede the state law; the County Manager or Chairman Pierce needs to meet with the Planning Board to discuss this matter further.

Mr. Gregory recommended the issue be tabled until he can meet with the Planning Board.

Chairman Pierce checked with the Board and they were all in agreement to table this.

Mr. Gregory discussed two boards that Commissioners have served on but are now vacant. These positions need to be filled. One is the East Carolina Behavioral Health Board previously held by Commissioner Brown and the other is the Solid Waste Board held by Commissioner Rountree.

Chairman Pierce addressed the East Carolina Behavioral Health Board and asked Commissioner Nickens to serve. Commissioner Nickens stated he would prefer to serve on the Solid Waste Board. Commissioner Jernigan will serve on the East Carolina Behavioral Health Board but would reserve the right to give up the position when other Board members become available to serve.

Mr. Gregory suggested each Board member stop by the County Manager's office and give a complete list of the boards they serve on so a list will be complete and updated.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to accept these appointments, Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Gregory was asked to look into an inter-local committee forming to fight the OLF. At the most recent OLF meeting held at Gates County High School, the consulting firm answered questions at the OLF meeting. The consulting firm and the Navy representatives are the same ones that have been there for the last seven years. He worked with them before in Perquimans County. These are the people you need to get to know, they can help you. He has not heard from Camden or Currituck County as of this morning, he has talked to Attorney Morrison representing them. Mr. Morrison states he needs to talk to each

Commissioner. Mr. Gregory will bring an update to the next meeting.

The Board reviewed the inter-local agreement proposed by Beaufort County regarding the new Stormwater Regulations. Mr. Gregory stated that the state has new statutes they want to pass. He has talked to the Beaufort County Manager. He understands how this will be an issue and why every county on the east coast needs to fight this issue. He recommends Gates County enter into the agreement with the other counties with a \$1,000.00 contribution.

Commissioner Jernigan stated that the reason our cost would be \$1,000 is that our numbers have been adjusted to fight OLF.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to support the inter-local agreement, Commissioner Askew seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Gregory discussed the advertisement for the County Manager position. He would like to pull the last advertisement used and revise it. The advertisement would run in the local paper and the Commissioners' Newsletter. Mr. Gregory advises that when you hire from outside the county, people will use Gates County as a stepping stone to a larger county. That will be less likely to occur if we hire a qualified local person.

Mr. Gregory discussed the surplus vehicles from GITS. Commissioner Jernigan stated that GITS has new vehicles. The mileage is high on the old ones. We need to advertise and sell the surplus vehicles on-line. There are four vehicles, two (2) lift equipped vans and two (2) standard vans, and one (1) surplus van that did not sell the last time.

Commissioner Jernigan made the motion to surplus the four (4) vans along with the one (1) that did not sell the last time, Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Mr. Gregory presented the smoking area update. He stated that UNC and other universities have banned smoking altogether. School systems are completely banned but this is hard to do for counties. Mr. Gregory suggested that signs be erected to direct people to dispose of butts properly and to possibly add more trash containers. Commissioner Nickens stated that the building is smoke free so he would like to see all county property be smoke free. Commissioner Jernigan stated he mentioned at the last meeting that he would like to see property smoke free, but there are employees that do smoke and he did not want to keep them from smoking on their break. He thinks they should have the right to smoke if they want. Commissioner Askew stated that we should let our employees smoke if they want. Commissioner Nickens gave the example of Albemarle Hospital that is smoke free. The employees have to leave on their lunch breaks or smoke in their cars.

Commissioner Nickens made the motion that the Gates County Courthouse be a smoke free facility. Commissioner Jernigan recommended all county buildings and properties become smoke free. Commissioner Nickens amended the motion that all buildings and grounds be tobacco free, Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Sandy Pittman, Finance Officer, reviewed budget amendments 66 through 76 and gave explanations for each.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to accept all budget amendments, Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Chris Hilbert with Holland Consulting Planners, Inc. discussed the Contract and Loan Awards for the FY07 NCHFA-SFR program. They are administering

\$200,000 program for Gates County that was funded last year. There are houses that they are finishing up and discussed what needs to be done to move forward with this project. They received 22 applications, 10 were not eligible, 12 were eligible and those applications are rated based on income, number of elderly and if taxes were being paid. They have two units to approve, one unit has quite a bit of lead paint on the exterior. They have already received bids for abatement. Board approval is needed to award contracts for the last two units and removal of lead paint. All costs are within perimeters of the program.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to approve the contract for lead abatement and construction, Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Commissioner Jernigan brought before the Board a request from Virginia Moore, Director of the Board of Elections. She asked if the elections volunteers could receive lapel pins with the county seal and logo. Mr. Gregory will work with Mrs. Moore to come up with a way to recognize these volunteers, We need to create a certificate as well. It was also discussed that other departments may have volunteers that need to be recognized, but at a minimal cost.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to recognize County volunteers with a pin and a certificate, Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Daniel Bazemore came before the Commissioners speaking on behalf of the 3,000 people that visit the Shoup's Landing on the Chowan River. Mr. Bazemore has spoken with wildlife officers with the Division of Marine Fisheries who were conducting a survey in Gates County. Mr. Bazemore presented the Board with a petition with 200 signatures in support of bathroom facilities at Shoup's Landing. He stated that between 5,000 and 6,000 use that landing per year. He asks the Board to support the cause and send a letter with the petition to the Wildlife Commission to request bathroom facilities at Shoup's Landing. The cost for port-a-johns per week is \$14.00. The petition states the dates the landing is most used and recommends the facilities be operational.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to write a letter to the Wildlife Commission requesting port-a-johns at both ramps, Shoup's and New Ferry Road, Chairman Nickens seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Renee McGinnis discussed tax foreclosures and related issues. Property with three years unpaid tax is eligible for foreclose. We currently have 35 parcels with four years delinquent taxes owed on \$75,000; 67 parcels with 3 years delinquent taxes owed on \$75,000; and 114 parcels with 2 years delinquent taxes owed on \$85,000. Mr. Godwin has 30 of those parcels, and has had those for two to four years with no contact. She has contacted Travis Ellis, Attorney at Law in Edenton. He has given his fees and timeframe of having properties sold at the courthouse within 75 days, provided the title searches are clear. The Tax Department would send a letter and have a collection period. The attorney would then send a letter and then proceed with foreclosure proceedings. The cost per parcel is approximately \$800 to \$1000; plus advertising fees, service fees, etc. Mr. Ellis would allow fees to come out of the sale, instead of costs being paid upfront. Mrs. McGinnis is asking for Board approval to proceed with working with Mr. Ellis on foreclosures.

Commissioner Askew commented he thought two years was long enough for taxes to be delinquent. Commissioner Jernigan states that all people should pay taxes on time, Commissioner Nickens agreed.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to foreclose on properties with two years delinquent taxes and to proceed with collection effective today, Commissioner Askew seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to use Travis Ellis, Attorney at Law, for collection services, Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Mrs. McGinnis discussed the Solid Waste Fee Ordinance. When that ordinance was put on record, we were billing on the tax bill. We are now billing on the water bill. She is having issues with citizens not understanding that ordinance and would like to see the ordinance updated to support the collection of the solid waste fees.

Chairman Pierce stated that the issue was addressed last year and he thought the ordinance was addressed at that time. A discussion ensued regarding how the fee is currently being billed.

Mr. Gregory recommended Mrs. McGinnis contact Chowan County to get a copy of their ordinance, have our attorney review it and present it to the Board at the May 19th meeting.

Mrs. McGinnis gave an update on a meeting she attended in Williamston regarding a cost-share program on mapping. Federal, state and local representatives are working together on a program to keep county maps updated every four years. If seven counties are working together then a cost savings could be recognized, with Gates County's savings of \$10,000 to \$15,000. The last time the cost was approximately \$55,000.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to go into a Closed Session, Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to re-inter into Regular Session. Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Commissioner Askew made a motion to appoint T. C. Vaughan and Billy Felton to the Board of Adjustments, Commissioner Jernigan seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Commissioner Jernigan made a motion to appoint Joe Greene to the Planning Board, Commissioner Nickens seconded the motion. The motion was unanimously approved.

Commissioner Jernigan made the motion to recess to reconvene May 5, 2008 at 1:15 pm as the Board of Equalization and Review.


