

**GATES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
REGULAR MEETING MINUTES
DECEMBER 1, 2014**

The Gates County Board of Commissioners met in Regular Session at 10:00 a.m. Monday, December 1, 2014 in the Main Court Room, 202 Court Street, Gatesville. Commissioners Jordan, Owens, Hofler, Felton and Freeman were present. Also present was County Manager, Natalie Rountree.

Chairman Jordan led in prayer and the pledge of allegiance.

Chairman Jordan called the meeting to order.

Oaths of Office

Nell Wiggins, Clerk of Court, swore in Commissioners J. Ray Freeman III, Jack Owens, & Billy Felton.

Selection of Chairman & Vice-Chairman

Natalie Rountree, County Manager, opened the floor for nominations for Chairman.

Commissioner Billy Felton nominated Linda Hofler to serve as Chairman. Commissioner Ray Freeman seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.

County Manager, Natalie Rountree, opened the floor for nominations for Vice-Chairman.

Commissioner Ray Freeman made a motion to nominate Jack Owens as vice-chairman. Commissioner Billy Felton seconded the motion; motion passed unanimously.

Approval of Minutes

Commissioner Jordan, Hofler and Felton stated corrections that need to be made on pages 1546, 1569, 1553, & 1570.

Commissioner Felton made a motion to approve the minutes as modified for October 29, 2014 & November 5, 2014. Commissioner Owens seconded the motion; motion carried unanimously.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to approve the minutes as modified for November 17, 2014. Commissioner Felton seconded the motion; motion carried unanimously.

Approval of Agenda

Madam Chairman Hofler stated the agenda needs to be adjusted to add a budget amendment as item 12 under New Business.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to approve the agenda as adjusted. Commissioner Owens seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.

Delegations – Unannounced

Thomas Hill, Republican Party Chairman, congratulated the victors of the election and thanked Sydney Pierce & Gary Ingram for their service to the County and for being representatives for Gates County. Mr. Hill stated he wanted to clear up a rumor that if Gary Ingram won the election all sheriff deputies would be fired, this rumor was simply not true. Mr. Hill informed the Board that even though there were several hiccups during the elections process he feels that the Board of Elections handled them well. He submitted a Freedom of Information request which was answered in an accurate and very timely answer by the Board of Elections and a copy of the request was given to each Commissioner for review. Mr. Hill thanked the Board of Elections for being able to answer in an accurate and timely manner. Mr. Hill also handed out the information to the Board expressing some of the issues and concerns that Republicans have and feels it is his responsibility to find out the answers to these concerns. He has made the information public to the Republican Party and will be making it public to the NAACP as well.

Mr. Hill stated he did not vote for Mr. Jordan in the last election but has appreciated the fairness that Mr. Jordan has always shown and looks forward to continuing to work with Mr. Jordan and the new Chair.

Delegations – Announced

Esther Lassiter, Gates Partners for Health, provided an update to the Board. Gates Partners for Health is a network of community partners dedicated to promoting healthy lifestyles for all ages. In the past six months there has been a focus on addressing Chronic Disease prevention and reduction and Gates Partners for Health has conducted several activities since July to address Chronic Disease including the Diabetes Symposium, Men's Health Forum, Cancer Support Group, Holy Soles Walking Challenge, Family Fun & Fitness Day and the Farmers Market. Ms. Lassiter announced that December 14th will end her employment as Coordinator of the Gates County Partners for Health. Ms. Lassiter thanked the Board for their involvement and financial support.

Madam Chairman Hofler thanked Ms. Lassiter for her service to the County.

Commissioner Owens stated Ms. Lassiter is a champion for the causes and has demonstrated fantastic reporting and leadership over the last nine years, she will be missed greatly.

Commissioner Jordan thanked Ms. Lassiter for her service to Gates Partners for Health and asked if she will be involved in any way from this point on. Ms. Lassiter said that she will continue to be vice-chair for the Gates Partners for Health Board and currently serves as the chair for the Chronic Disease Committee.

Commissioner Felton thanked Ms. Lassiter for her dedication, service and for helping to lead others to better health.

Commissioner Freeman thanked Ms. Lassiter for her committed service to promote better health for the citizens of the county.

Administrative Reports

Natalie Rountree, County Manager, stated the report is October 10 to November 21, 2014. Ms. Rountree explained that the full time building inspector position was approved and Bud Perrone has accepted the position and begins work today. The Department of Commerce, Secretary Sharon Decker visited the County on October 30th. While visiting she toured the Historic Courthouse, visited the EOC, stopped by Merchants Commerce Park, and met with local business owners at Merchants Millpond. On Halloween staff handed out treats and socialized with citizens, we would like to thank the Sheriff's Office and the Fire Department for partnering with the County. Ms. Rountree informed the Board of several meetings that she has attended over the past month. Ms. Rountree provided the Board with information on the Navy's proposed Joint Land Use Plan which will be discussed at the January meeting. Ms. Rountree attended the Planning Board meeting and presented the request for a zoning text amendment, the Planning Board will have a recommendation ready at the December 16th meeting. Ms. Rountree thanked everyone that attended and assisted with the Thanksgiving lunch that was held at the community center. In closing Ms. Rountree let the Board know that Andrus hopes to receive the steel by the end of this week to begin work next week to finish the structural repairs for the Historic Courthouse.

There were no questions for the County Manager.

Lori Chavis, Deputy Clerk, presented a tax refund for the Board's approval for Lori George in the amount of \$120.05 due to overpayment online.

Chairman Jordan asked if the overage amount was paid to the DMV. Ms. Chavis stated that the citizen paid the amount twice; she paid to the County and then paid the full amount to the DMV. Chairman Jordan asked how often we receive the payments from DMV. Ms. Pittman explained that we receive DMV payments monthly.

Commissioner Felton made a motion to approve the refund for Lori George in the amount of \$120.05. Commissioner Owens seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.

Commissioner Jordan noted that the Building & Grounds report states that the painting on the historic courthouse is on hold and asked Ms. Rountree if she had any details that she could share on the progress of painting. Ms. Rountree explained that the painting is on hold until the west wing is completed. Painting and lift rental will resume once the exterior work is completed.

Madam Chairman Hofler announced that the Christmas Parade will be on December 13th at 3pm and the County Holiday Celebration will be on December 23rd at 3pm.

Commissioner Jordan asked about several of the dates that were listed in a letter from the RPO. Ms. Rountree stated she would contact Angela Welsh and request a letter with corrected dates.

Ms. Rountree informed the Board that it has been recommended that the Planning Board, Board of Adjustment and the Board of Commissioners hold a joint meeting on January 20, 2015.

Commissioner Felton made a motion to have a joint meeting with the Planning Board and Board of Adjustment on January 20th and if necessary the Commissioners will hold an administrative meeting directly after. Commissioner Owens seconded the motion; motion passed unanimously.

Public Hearings

None

Old Business

Mike McAllister, MESCO, stated Don Wells has made contact with Albemarle Regional Health and found out that the process will take about 9 months, since it is greater than 3000 gallons per day the State will more than likely get involved.

Commissioner Jordan asked what other options are we talking about. Mr. McAllister explained that unless there are other potential areas the drip system is the main other option.

Mr. McAllister stated the first step will be a preliminary report on the property and then we will make application to the local health department then to DHHS. It will be a back and forth process with the organizations. Commissioner Owens asked if through the process will they ask for a recommendation. Mr. McAllister stated the first step is to get the information from the soil scientist to make the recommendation.

Commissioner Jordan stated if we go down this route we need some assurance whether or not it is going to work because it will require acquiring the property, the current option to purchase ends in January. Mr. McAllister explained that when you are dealing with permitting nothing is fail safe until you have a permit in hand and then you risk having a recall. It is a better fit than the sprayfield and you have more options.

Commissioner Owens asked Mr. McAllister if he has any knowledge on the Currituck system. Mr. McAllister stated he is familiar with the type but doesn't have specific knowledge of the system in Currituck.

Commissioner Jordan asked about the denial from NCDENR. Mr. McAllister feels that based on the information and numbers it is fairly certain that NCDENR will send a denial letter. Commissioner Jordan feels that we need to get in touch with the land owner to see if they are willing to work with us through a 9 month process considering our current option to purchase agreement ends in January.

The Commissioners reviewed the following proclamation requested by the Chowanoke Indian Tribe:

**PROCLAMATION
FOR THE
RECOGNITION OF THE CHOWANOKE INDIAN TRIBE
2014**

WHEREAS, the Chowanoke Indians had a reservation in Gates County, North Carolina and now hold title to a parcel of those reservation lands.

WHEREAS, the Chowanoke Indians have now identified themselves a distinct community and are known by Gates County to be the descendants of that nation.

WHEREAS, the descendants of said Indians have been documented through various land sales, deeds, and historical research.

WHEREAS, the Chowanoke Indians attended the first Indian school in North Carolina founded by Edward Mashburn

NOW, THEREFORE, the Gates County Board of Commissioners, do hereby proclaim County Recognition of the **CHOWANOKE INDIAN TRIBE** in Gates County, North Carolina and commend this acknowledgement to all citizens.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and affixed the GREAT SEAL of GATES COUNTY in Gatesville this the 1st day of December in the year of our Lord Two Thousand and Fourteen

Madam Chairman Hofler informed the Board that the Chowanoke are interested in the reservation that was here many many years ago but they are not recognized as an Indian Nation.

Commissioner Owens feels everyone is interested in what they are trying to accomplish but would prefer that we not address the issue today and continue to do some more research before we make a final decision.

Commissioner Felton noted that some of the wording on the recommended proclamation may need to be clarified.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to table the Proclamation of Recognition of the Chowanoke Indian Tribe until we have further researched and requested documentation from the representatives of the Chowanoke Tribe. Commissioner Freeman seconded the motion; motion passed unanimously.

New Business

Madam Chairman Hofler stated that previous Commissioner Ken Jernigan served on the Albemarle Regional Health Services Board & the GITS Board. Now that Mr. Jernigan no longer serves as commissioner the Board needs to appoint someone to fill his spot on each of these boards.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to appoint Commissioner Freeman to the Albemarle Regional Health Services Board & the GITS Board. Commissioner Felton seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.

Natalie Rountree, County Manager, presented a request from the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners EMS Medicaid Cost Settlement Program. Currently Gates County is one of 7 counties where the county does not solely operate EMS and we do not have a contract with a service provider. EMS would like to complete the application for the EMS Federal Medicaid Settlement Program which would allow them to recoup some of the costs for services they provide. The North Carolina Association of County Commissioners will complete the paperwork and keep a small portion of the money as administrator and then would pass down the money to the County for EMS. EMS has to have permission from the Board to use the program before they can continue to complete the application. The county will be required to sign a contract stating that Gates County EMS is our EMS provider. The contract will allow them to participate in the program and would allow Gates County EMS to be eligible to

apply for FEMA money if a state of emergency should occur. The County would serve as a pass through for the funds and would funnel through the county finance department.

Commissioner Jordan said that he would be in favor of the contract but would recommend that we look into receiving funds for our portion of the administration.

Commissioner Owens clarified that we will revisit the issue before we sign a contract. Ms. Rountree explained we will review the contract once the application is complete and a contract has been drafted.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to approve the EMS application for the Federal Medicaid Settlement Program and to find out if there are any provisions for reimbursement of administrative costs. Commissioner Freeman seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.

The Board reviewed and considered the following resolution opposing the ruling on same sex marriage:

**GATES COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS
A RESOLUTION
IN OPPOSITION OF RULING ON "SAME-SEX MARRIAGE"**

WHEREAS, in May 2012, the voters of North Carolina voted victoriously to amend the North Carolina Constitution protecting marriage; **AND**

WHEREAS, prior to the rulings by Judge Cogburn and Judge Osteen, the word "marriage" meant only a legal union between one (1) man and one (1) women as husband and wife, and the word "spouse" referred only to a person of the opposite sex who is a husband or wife; **AND**

WHEREAS, on Friday, October 10, 2014, United States District Court Judge Max Cogburn ruled that Article XIV, Section 6 of the North Carolina Constitution (Amendment One), North Carolina General Statute 51-1, which defines marriage as being between a man and a women, 51-1.2, which prohibits recognition of same-sex marriage in other states, and all sources of state law that prohibit same-sex marriage or its recognition, are unconstitutional under the Due Process and Equal Protection Clauses of the 14th Amendment to the United States Constitution; **AND**

WHEREAS, on Tuesday, October 14, 2014, United States District Court Judge William Osteen ruled that Article XIV, Section 6 of the North Carolina Constitution (Amendment One), North Carolina General Statutes 51-1 and 51-2 are unconstitutional under the Due Process and Equal Protection Clauses of the 14th Amendment to the United States Constitution; **AND**

WHEREAS, this ruling will have a negative impact on our churches, businesses, charity organizations, government offices, society and our educational system.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Gates County Board of Commissioners strongly opposes the ruling that Article XIV, Section 6 of the North Carolina Constitution (Amendment One), North Carolina General Statute 51-1, which defines marriage as being between a man and a woman, 51-1.2, which prohibits recognition of same-sex marriage in other states, and all sources of state law that prohibit same-sex marriage or its recognition are unconstitutional under the Due Process and Equal Protection Clauses of the 14th Amendment to the United States Constitution; **AND**

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Gates County Board of Commissioners strongly request that this ruling be reviewed and reconsidered to protect the foundation on which America was established; **AND**

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Gates County Board of Commissioners strongly urges everyone in opposition of this decision to let their voices be heard, and encourages everyone to recognize **"marriage between one (1) man and one (1) woman is the only domestic legal union that shall be valid or recognized in this state. This**

section does not prohibit a private party from entering into contracts with another private party; nor does this section prohibit courts from adjudicating the rights of private parties pursuant to such contracts”.

Commissioner Owens asked if this item is coming before the commissioners due to a magistrate in the neighboring county refusing to conduct a ceremony. Ms. Rountree said that the resolution was approved by some other counties across the state and was sent to our Board for consideration.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to approve the Resolution Opposing the Ruling on Same Sex Marriage. Commissioner Felton seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.

The Board viewed an update video sent out by the North Carolina Association of County Commissioners.

Ms. Rountree shared an update on the Northeast Alliance including a letter from Van Rogerson. The Northeast Alliance represents 16 counties and all of their funding from the legislature ended on July 1st. Since then the NE Commission has become the NE Alliance and the goal is to continue to operate and represent the counties that they have always represented however they have realized that what they wanted to do is not economically feasible, their Board meet during October and November to decide to partner with NC East. They have since signed a non-binding letter of intent to merge with NC East for a five year provisional program. Each county will be allowed to participate equally as affiliates. The Northeast will be given seats on the East Alliance Board and an office will remain in Edenton and Williamston. This was brought up at a meeting Ms. Rountree attended last week; it was a great shock for all of the economic directors that were in the room. They have informed counties that they will have about five years of marking that will cover from Lenoir to the Virginia boarder. After five years if Gates County continues to participate in the NE Alliance we will have to pay just over \$3,000 per year. For those in the room that did not have a full time planner they felt this was a good deal. There are some counties that are not happy and feel that the economic developers should have been given an option to express their opinions.

Commissioner Owens feels that it would be beneficial for the Board to vote on the issue when they meet as the Economic Development Commission Board.

The Board was in agreement that it appears to be beneficial for the County and would like to continue the discussion at the Economic Development Commissioner Board meeting.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to add the topic to the Economic Development Commission Agenda following the 3pm joint meeting on January 20, 2015. Commissioner Owens seconded the motion; motion passed unanimously.

Sandy Pittman, Finance Director, presented Budget Amendment 9.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to approve budget amendment 9 as presented. Commissioner Owens seconded the motion; motion passed unanimously.

Citizen Comments

Reba Green-Holley, Chairman of the Gates Partners for Health, recognized Ms. Lassiter for her continued service. Ms. Holley stated that her shoes will be hard to fill as she has been an engaged and active employee. She has been very innovative, collaborative, and passionate while conducting her work. The Albemarle Health Department will be advertising the position on a contract basis.

Commissioner Comments

Commissioner Owens welcomed Mr. Freeman to the Board and thanked Trish for her attendance and support of the Board. Commissioner Owens thanked Commissioner Jordan for his service as chairman.

Commissioner Jordan thanked citizens for attending, local government is where the rubber hits the road. Commissioner Jordan welcomed Mr. Freeman and said that it is a great job and is very rewarding. Commissioner Jordan said that as the position of chairman has changed and we will need to appoint a new commissioner to sit with the new Chairman on the Personnel Board

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to appoint Commissioner Felton to the personnel board. Commissioner Freeman seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.

Commissioner Felton thanked citizens for attending and said that the Board is looking forward to a good year and a year of transparency so every citizen in the County knows what is going on and welcomed Mr. Freeman to the Board.

Commissioner Freeman thanked citizens for their support and stated it is an honor to serve the citizens and the administration.

Commissioner Hofler thanked citizens for attending and invited everyone back for next month's meeting. Commissioner Hofler stated she plans to have open and fair exchanges so that everyone is aware of what is going on in the County. Commissioner Hofler thanked Commissioner Jordan for his service as chair and welcomed Mr. Freeman to the Board.

Closed Session

Commissioner Owens made a motion to enter into closed session pursuant to NCGS 143-318.11 a (3) Legal, (4) Economic Development, (5) Real Estate, (6) Personnel. Commissioner Freeman seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to exit closed session. Commissioner Felton seconded the motion; motion carried without opposition.

Adjournment

Commissioner Jordan made a motion to authorize MESCO to submit the report to NCDENR for permitting. Commissioner Owens seconded the motion; motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to authorize the County Manager to draft a letter to the retiree as discussed in closed session. Commissioner Freeman seconded the motion; motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to Authorize the County Manager, & Attorney Commissioner Jordan to contact the landowner for additional negotiations involving land acquisitions. Commissioner Jordan seconded the motion; motion passed unanimously.

Commissioner Owens made a motion to instruct the County Manager to offer the settlement as discussed in closed session. Commissioner Freeman seconded the motion; Commissioners Owens, Felton, Freeman, & Hofler voted in favor. Commissioner Jordan voted against. Motion passed four to one.

Commissioner Felton made a motion to adjourn. Commissioner Freeman seconded the motion; motion passed without opposition.
